Sub: Low Pressure Area over northeast Bay of Bengal. To intensify into a depression by tomorrow morning

A Low Pressure Area formed over northeast and adjoining areas of eastcentral Bay of Bengal, Bangladesh & Myanmar coasts in the morning (0530 hours IST) of today, the 18th August, 2022 and persisted over the same region in the forenoon of today.

It is very likely to move northwestwards and become well marked low pressure area during next 06 hours. Continuing to move northwestwards, it is likely to concentrate into a Depression by tomorrow morning over North Bay of Bengal and adjoining West Bengal & Bangladesh coasts. Thereafter, it is likely to move west-northwestwards across Gangetic West Bengal, North Odisha, Jharkhand and North Chattisgarh.

Warnings:

Rainfall:

18th August: Rainfall at most places with heavy at isolated places is very likely over coastal areas of North Odisha and Gangetic West Bengal.

19th August: Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over North Odisha. Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places over South Odisha & Gangetic West Bengal and heavy rainfall at isolated places over Jharkhand, Chattisgarh & East Madhya Pradesh.

20th August: Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over North Chattisgarh & East Madhya Pradesh. Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places over Northwest Odisha,

Jharkhand & Vidarbha. Rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall isolated places over remaining parts of Odisha, south Chhattisgarh and West Madhya Pradesh.

21st August: Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over West Madhya Pradesh. Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places over East Madhya Pradesh & East Rajasthan. Rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places over Chattisgarh & Vidarbha.

22nd August: Rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places over East Rajasthan. Rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh.

Wind:

18th **August**: Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph over North and adjoining Eastcentral Bay of Bengal along & off Myanmar-Bangladesh-West Bengal & Odisha coasts.

19th **August:** Squally wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph over North and adjoining Westcentral Bay of Bengal along & off West Bengal, Odisha & Bangladesh coasts.

20th August: Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 65 kmph over Northwest Bay of Bengal along & off West Bengal and Odisha coasts

Sea condition:

Sea condition is likely to be rough to very rough over Northeast Bay of Bengal, adjoining Eastcentral & Northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Myanmar-Bangladesh-West Bengal & Odisha coasts on 18th & 19th. Sea condition would gradually improve becoming rough over Northwest Bay of Bengal along & off West Bengal and Odisha coasts on 20th August.

Fishermen are advised not to venture into North & adjoining Eastcentral Bay of Bengal and along & off Myanmar-Bangladesh-West Bengal & Odisha coasts on 18th & 19th and into Northwest Bay of Bengal along & off West Bengal and Odisha coasts on 20th August.




