Sub: Deep Depression over north Andaman Sea and adjoining areas of southeast and eastcentral Bay of Bengal: Pre cyclone watch for Andaman Islands and adjoining sea areas (Yellow Message)

The Deep Depression over north Andaman Sea and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal, moved nearly northwards with a speed of 13 kmph during last 06 hours, and lay centered at 1730 hours IST of today, 21st March, over north Andaman Sea and adjoining areas of southeast and eastcentral Bay of Bengal, near latitude 13.3 Degree North and longitude 94.0 Degree East, about 120 km east-northeast of Mayabundar (Andaman Islands), 230 km north-northeast of Port Blair (Andaman Islands), 450 km south-southwest of Yangon (Myanmar) and 570 km south-southwest of Thandwe (Myanmar).

It is likely to intensify further into a cyclonic storm during next 12 hours. It would continue to move nearly northwards away from Andaman Islands and cross Myanmar coast between latitude 18 Degree North & 19 Degree North around Thandwe (Myanmar) during early hours of 23rd March.

Forecast track and intensity are given in the following table:

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall (warning graphics enclosed)

21st March: Light to moderate rainfall/thundershower at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over north Andaman Islands and heavy rainfall at isolated places over South Andaman Islands during next 06 hours. Light to moderate rainfall at a few places is likely over Nicobar Islands.

(ii) Wind warning

- ➤ 21st March: Squally winds speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph prevails over Andaman and Nicobar Islands, eastcentral Bay of Bengal and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal.
- ▶ 22nd March: Gale winds speed reaching 65-75 kmph gusting to 85 kmph very likely to prevail over eastcentral Bay of Bengal and adjoining north Andaman Sea & along & off Myanmar coast. It is likely to weaken gradually becoming squally winds speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph over the same region from 22nd evening. Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail over north Andaman Islands and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal, northeast Bay of Bengal and along & off southeast Bangladesh coast.
- ➤ 23rd March: Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail over eastcentral Bay of Bengal, adjoining northeast Bay of Bengal and along & off north Myanmar southeast Bangladesh coasts till evening.

(iii) Sea condition

- **21**st **March**: Sea condition is very rough prevailing over north Andaman Sea and adjoining southeast & eastcentral Bay of Bengal.
- 22nd March: Sea condition is very likely to become very rough to high over eastcentral Bay of Bengal and north Andaman Sea and along & off Myanmar coast. It would be rough to very rough over adjoining southeast & northeast Bay of Bengal and along & off southeast Bangladesh coast during the same period.
- 23rd March: Sea condition is very likely to be rough to very rough over eastcentral Bay of Bengal, North Andaman Sea and adjoining northeast Bay of Bengal & along & off north Myanmar- southeast Bangladesh coasts till evening.

(iv) Fishermen Warning (Graphics enclosed)

Fishermen are advised not to venture

- Into southeast Bay of Bengal on 21st March.
- Into Andaman Sea and along & off Andaman and Nicobar Islands during 21st to 22nd March.
- Into eastcentral Bay of Bengal during 21st to 23rd March and into northeast Bay of Bengal on 22rd and 23rd March.

(v) EXPECTED IMPACT & ACTION SUGGESTED for Andaman and Nicobar Islands

A. Impact Expected

- Breaking of tree branches and uprooting of small trees.
- Partial disruption of power and communication lines.
- > Localized Flooding of roads, inundation and water logging in low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.

- Adverse impact on marine and tourist activities along the coasts.
- Damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to squally wind and inundation.

B. Action Suggested

- Total suspension of fishing and tourism activities during 21st to 22nd March.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- People are advised to be in safe areas and avoid staying in vulnerable structure.
- ➤ Regulate and suspend off-shore activities during 21st to 22nd March.
- Regulate air-traffic on 21st March, 2022.
- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.

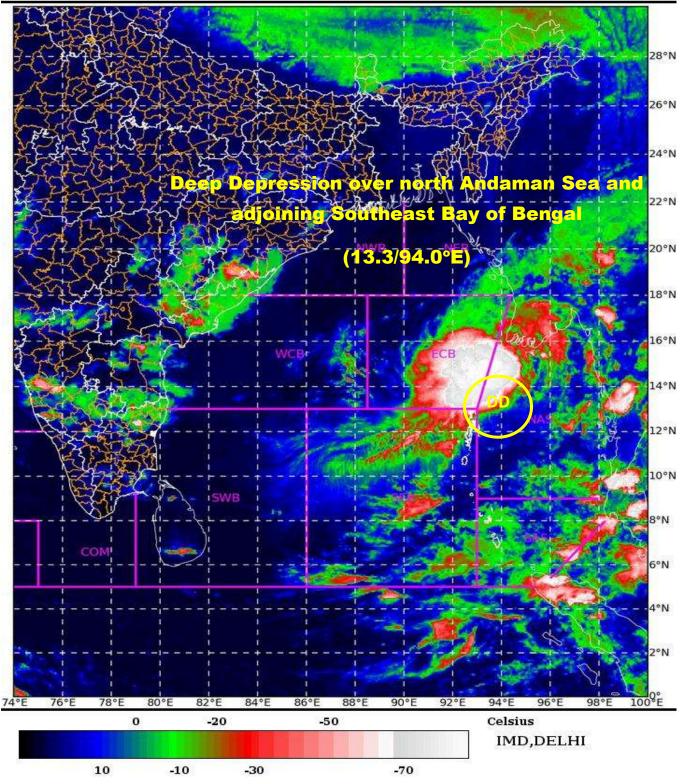

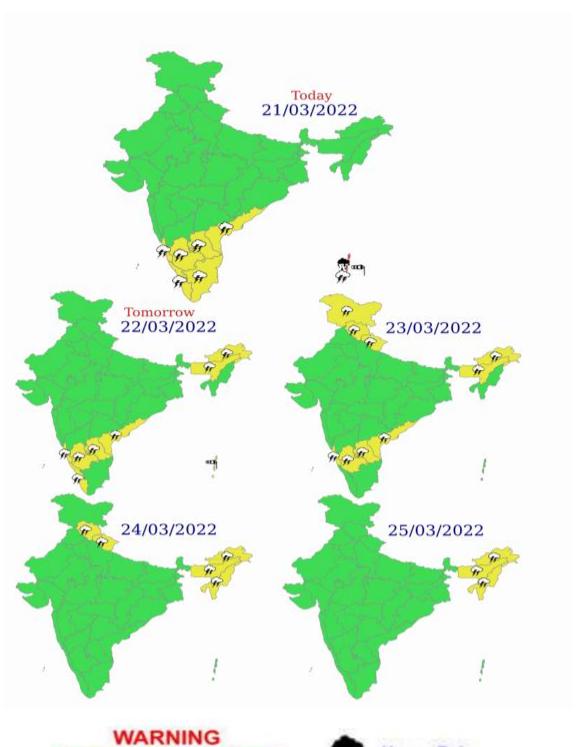

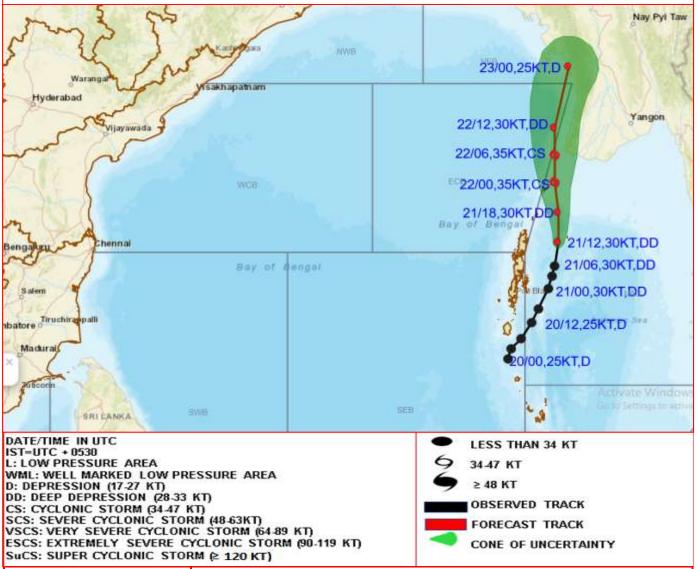

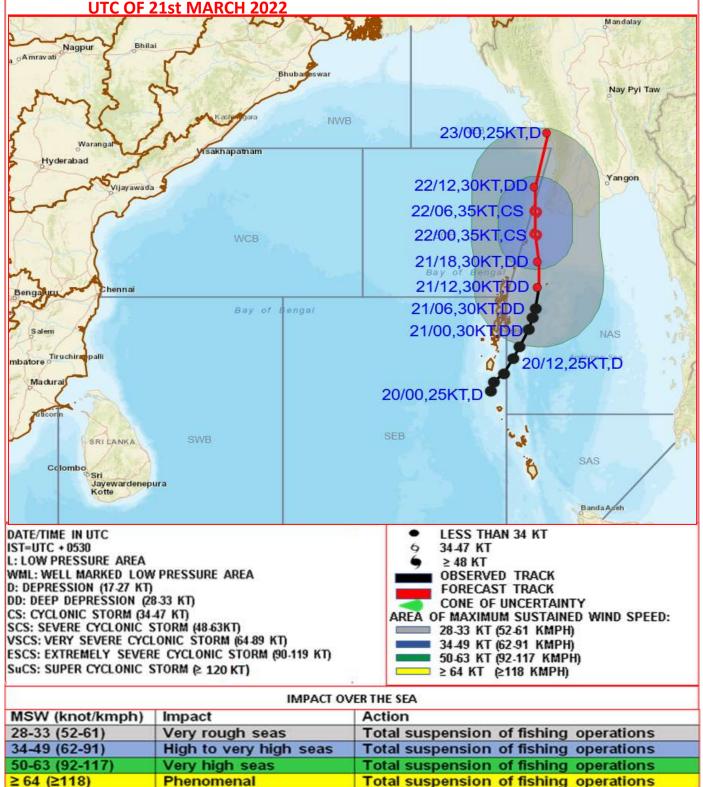

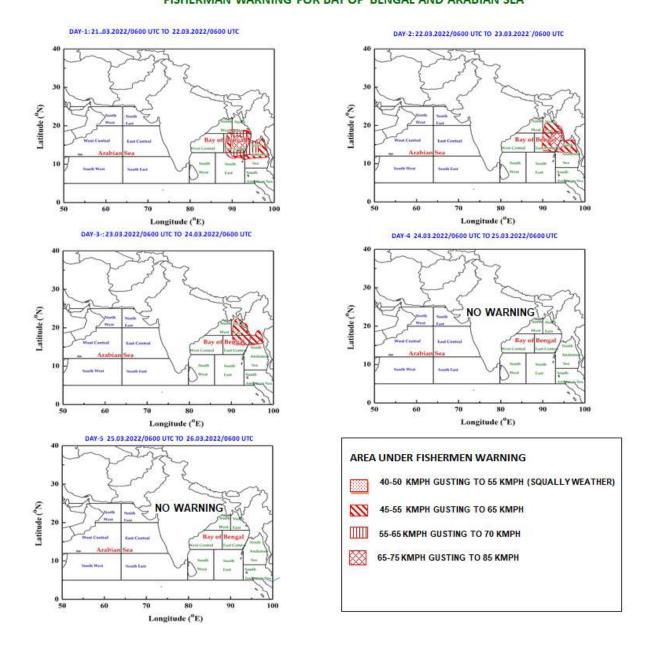
