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Sub: Depression over Northeast Arabian Sea off Saurashtra and Kutch coasts

The depression over Northeast Arabian Sea off Saurashtra and Kutch coasts moved west-northwestwards during last 6 hours with a speed of 15 kmph and lay centered at 1130 hours IST of 17th July, 2022 over the same region near latitude 23.2°N and longitude 67.8°E, about 250 km northwest of Porbandar (Gujarat), 150 km west-northwest of Okha (Gujarat), 110 km west of Naliya (Gujarat) and 200 km south-southeast of Karachi (Pakistan).

It is very likely to maintain the intensity of depression during next 12 hours and weaken gradually thereafter. It is very likely to move nearly westwards towards Oman coast as a remnant low pressure area across northwest Arabian Sea during next 36 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall (warning graphics enclosed)

17th July: Light to moderate rainfall at many places very likely over Saurashtra & Kutch. Thereafter, there will be no adverse impact of this system on rainfall over the state.

(ii) Wind warning

17th July: Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph very likely along & off Gujarat Coasts till evening of today, the 17th July and decrease thereafter gradually becoming 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph by 18th morning.

Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph very likely over northeast and adjoining northwest Arabian Sea. Strong winds with speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph very likely over westcentral and adjoining southwest Arabian Sea. Strong winds with speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph very likely over eastcentral and adjoining south Arabian Sea.

18th July: Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph very likely over northwest Arabian Sea. Strong winds with speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph very likely over westcentral Arabian Sea.

(iii) Sea condition

17th **July:** Sea condition is very likely to become rough to very rough along & off Gujarat coast and over northeast & adjoining northwest Arabian Sea and central & adjoining south Arabian Sea.

18th July: Sea condition is very likely to become rough to very rough over northwest Arabian Sea and westcentral Arabian Sea.

(iv) Fishermen Warning

17th July: Fishermen are advised not to venture along & off Gujarat coast and into northeast Arabian Sea and central & adjoining south Arabian Sea.

18th **July:** Fishermen are advised not to venture into northwest Arabian Sea and westcentral Arabian Sea.

The system is under continuous surveillance and the next message will be issued at 2030 hours IST of 17th July, 2022.

D: DEPRESSION (17-27 KT)


DD: DEEP DEPRESSION (28-33 KT) CS: CYCLONIC STORM (34-47 KT)

VSCS: VERY SEVERE CYCLONIC STORM (64-89 KT)


ESCS: EXTREMELY SEVERE CYCLONIC STORM (90-119 KT)
