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Sub: a)Depression over north Tamil Nadu and neighbourhood & b)Well marked low pressure area over East Central Arabian Sea

a)Depression over north Tamil Nadu and neighbourhood

The Depression over north coastal Tamil Nadu moved west-northwestwards with a speed of 12 kmph during past 6 hours and lay centred at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 19th November 2021, over north Tamil Nadu and neighbourhood, near Lat. 12.7°N and Long. 79.7°E, about 60 km east-southeast of Vellore. It is very likely to continue to move west-northwestwards and weaken gradually into a Well Marked Low Pressure Area during next 06 hours.

(i) Rainfall (warning graphics enclosed)

19th Nov.: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places very likely over Rayalaseema and south interior Karnataka and heavy rainfall at isolated places over north interior Tamil Nadu south, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Coastal and north interior Karnataka and Kerala.

(ii) Wind warning

Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph likely to prevail over southwest & adjoining west-central Bay of Bengal, Gulf of Mannar, Comorin Area and along & off Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and adjoining south Andhra Pradesh coasts during next 06 hours and decrease gradually thereafter.

(iii) Sea condition

Sea condition will be rough to very rough over southwest & adjoining west-central Bay of Bengal, Gulf of Mannar, Comorin Area and along & off Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and adjoining south Andhra Pradesh coasts during next 06 hours and improve gradually thereafter.

(iv) Fishermen Warning

Fishermen are advised not to venture into southwest & adjoining west-central Bay of Bengal, Gulf of Mannar, Comorin Area and along & off Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and adjoining south Andhra Pradesh coasts during next 06 hours. (Graphics enclosed).

(v) EXPECTED IMPACT (Rayalaseema and south interior Karnataka on 19th November) & ACTION SUGGESTED

A. Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, inundation and water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides
- > Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to flood water inundation.

B. Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

b) Well marked low pressure area over East Central Arabian Sea

Yesterday's low pressure area over Eastcentral Arabian Sea lay as a well marked low pressure area at 0830 hours IST of today, the 19th November over the same region. It is likely to concentrate into a depression over the same area during next 24 hours. **As the system will move away from Indian coast, no adverse weather likely over Indian landmass.**

(i) Wind warning

• Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph very likely over Eastcentral Arabian Sea on 19th and 20th and then decrease gradually thereafter.

(ii)Sea condition

Sea condition will be rough to very rough over Eastcentral Arabian Sea on 19th and 20th and then improve gradually thereafter.

(iii) Fishermen Warning


Fishermen are advised not to venture into Eastcentral Arabian Sea on 19th and 20th. (Graphics enclosed).


