Latest satellite imagery and observations indicate that a depression has formed over north Andaman Sea and lay centred at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 08th October 2013 near latitude 12.0^oN and longitude 96.0^oE, about 350 km east-northeast of Port Blair, 1450 km east-southeast of Paradip, 1520 km east-southeast of Visakhapatnam. The system would intensify into a deep depression and further into a cyclonic storm by tomorrow. It would move west-northwestwards towards north Andhra Pradesh and Odisha coast during next 72 hours.

Under the influence of this system, rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy falls at a few places would occur over Andaman and Nicobar Islands during next 48 hrs. Isolated extremely heavy falls (⁻ 25cm) would occur over Andaman Islands during the same period.

Squally winds speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph would prevail over Andaman Nicobar Islands and adjoining sea areas during next 48 hours. Sea condition will be rough to very rough along and off Nicobar Islands during this period.

Fishermen of Andaman Nicobar Islands are advised not to venture into the sea during next 48 hrs.

The system would intensify into a cyclonic storm during next 12 hours. It would move west-northwestwards and cross Andaman islands near Mayabandar by noon of today, the 9th October 2013 as a cyclonic storm. It would then continue to move west-northwestwards for some time and then northwestwards and cross north Andhra Pradesh and Odisha coast between Kalingapatnam and Paradip by night of 12th October, 2013 as a very severe cyclonic storm with a maximum sustained wind speed of 175-185 kmph.

The system would move west-northwestwards and cross Andaman Island close to Mayabandar within next few hours. The system would intensify into a cyclonic storm during next 12 hours and continue to move west-northwestwards for some time and then northwestwards and cross north Andhra Pradesh and Odisha coast between Kalingapatnam and Paradip by night of 12th October, 2013 as a very severe cyclonic storm with a maximum sustained wind speed of 175-185 kmph.
