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Subject: Well Marked Low Pressure Area Over Eastcentral & Adjoining Northeast Arabian Sea.

The Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea moved east-northeastwards, weakened into a well marked low pressure area and lay centered at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 1st November 2025, over Eastcentral & adjoining Northeast Arabian Sea.

It is likely to continue to move east-northeastwards towards South Gujarat and adjoining North Maharashtra coasts across northeast Arabian Sea and weaken into a Low-Pressure Area during next 24 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Gujarat region: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places is very likely on 1st and 2nd November.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st and 2nd November.

North Konkan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st and 2nd November.

North Madhya Maharashtra: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st and 2nd November.

Wind warning:

Squally weather with speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is very likely to prevail over Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till evening of 2nd November and decrease thereafter.

(ii) Sea condition:

Sea Condition is likely to be rough to moderate over Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till evening of 2nd November and improve thereafter.

(iii) Fishermen warnings:

Fishermen are advised not to venture into Northeast & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till evening of 2nd November.

(iv) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain and strong winds (North Konkan and coastal districts of Gujarat state) on 1st November

Impact expected:

- ❖ Strong - squally wind and heavy rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutchha houses/walls, huts and roads due to strong winds and heavy rain.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain.
- ❖ There could be localised flash floods, landslides/mudslides/landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Small ships & country boats may get affected due to strong winds and heavy rain.
- ❖ Surface & Helicopter services may be regulated.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Surface transport and helicopter services to be regulated.

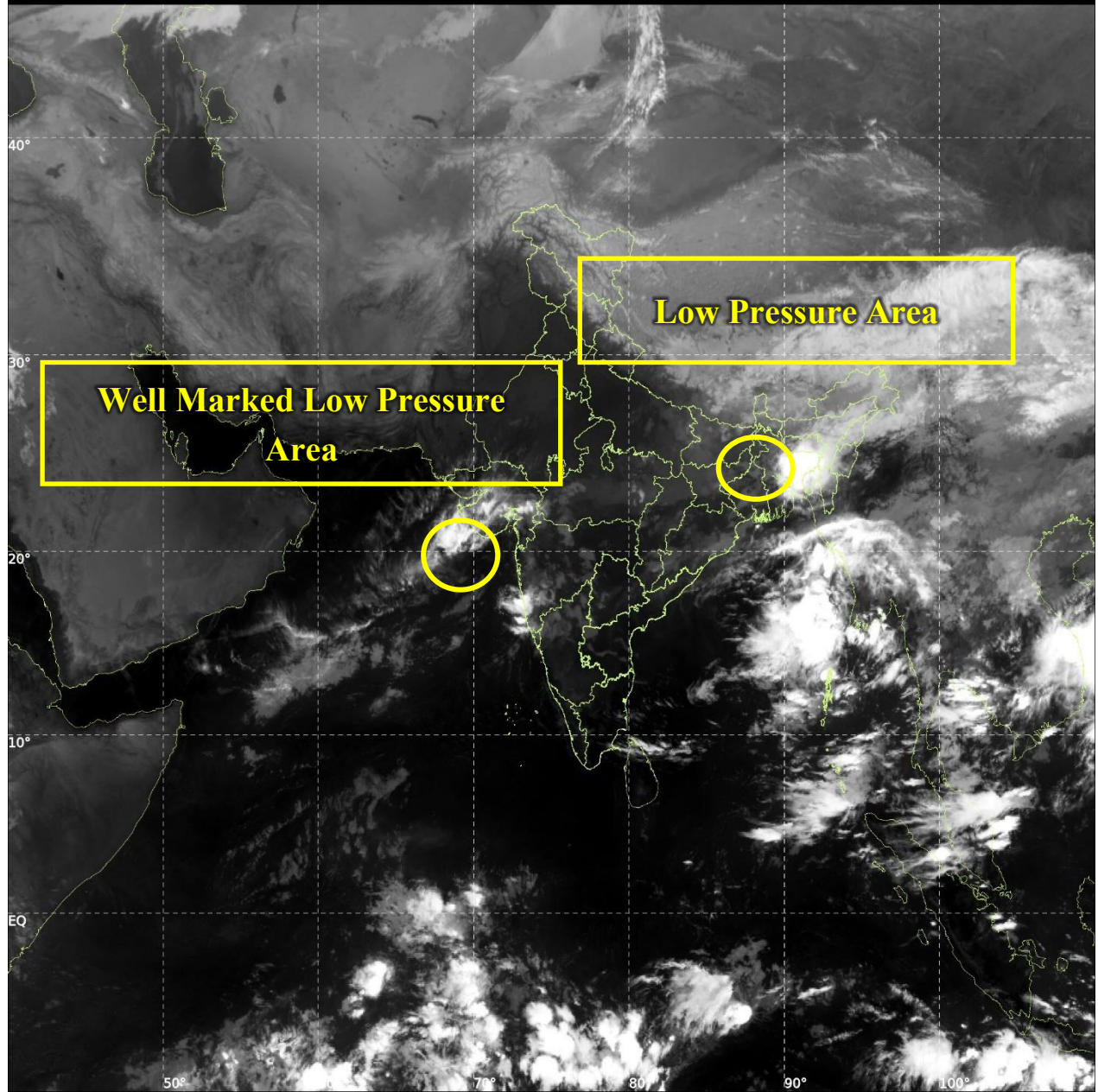

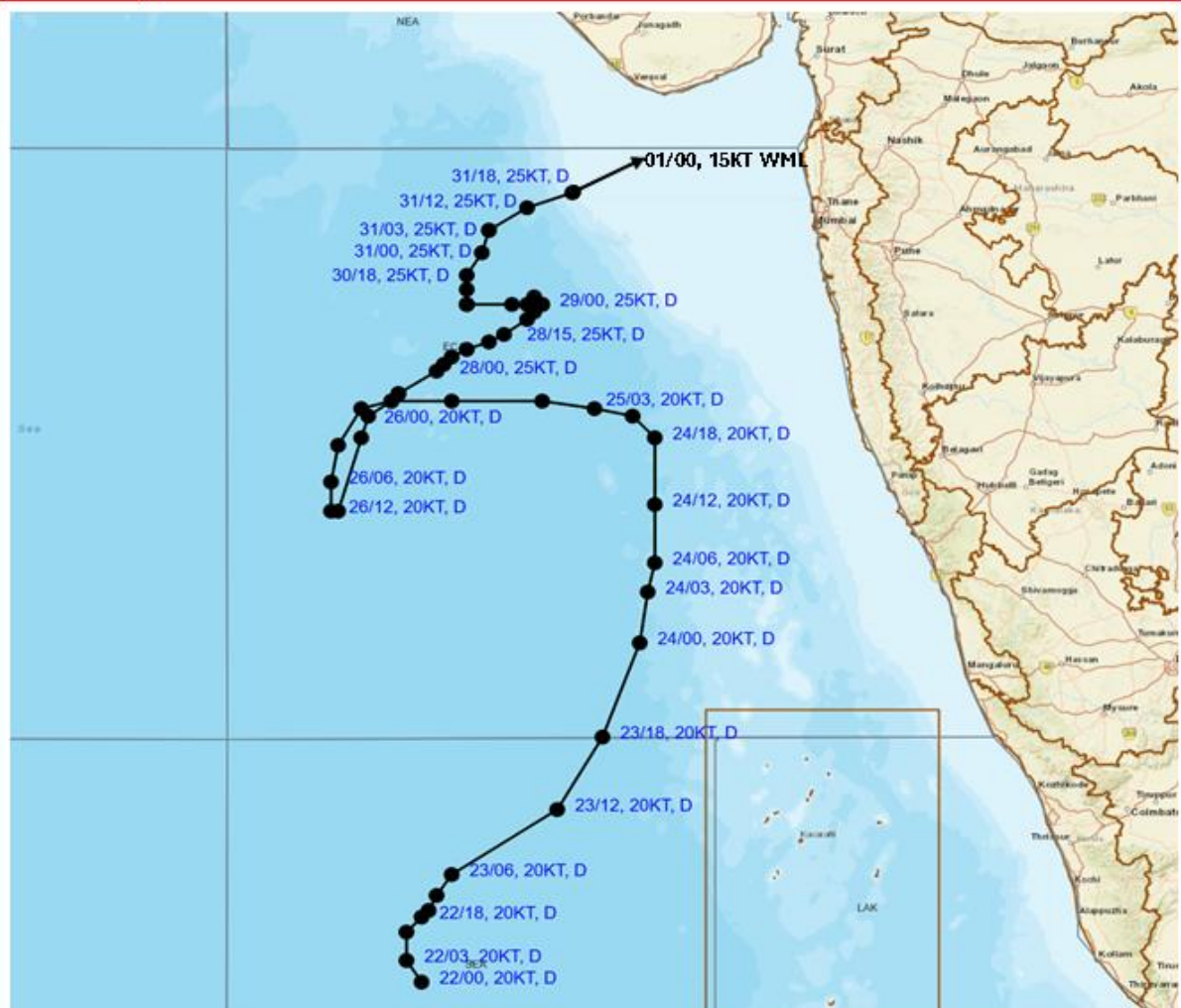

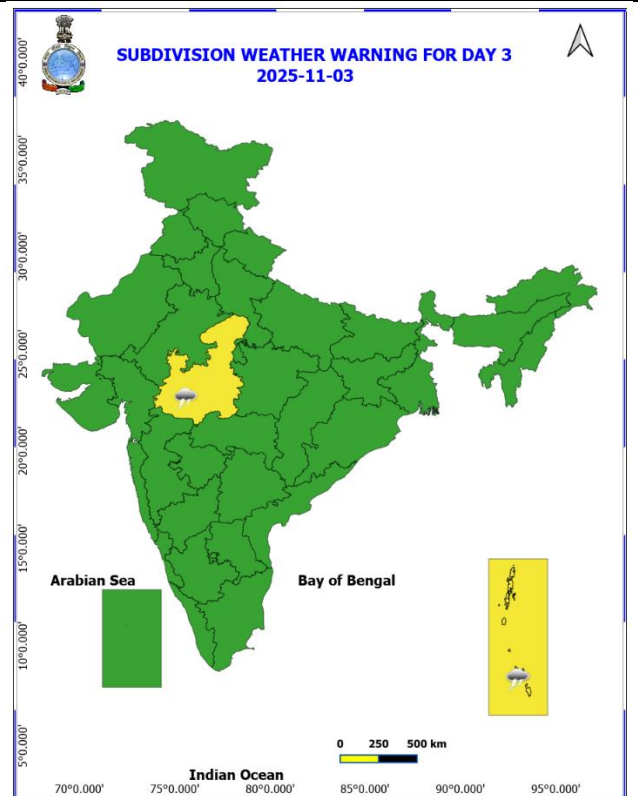
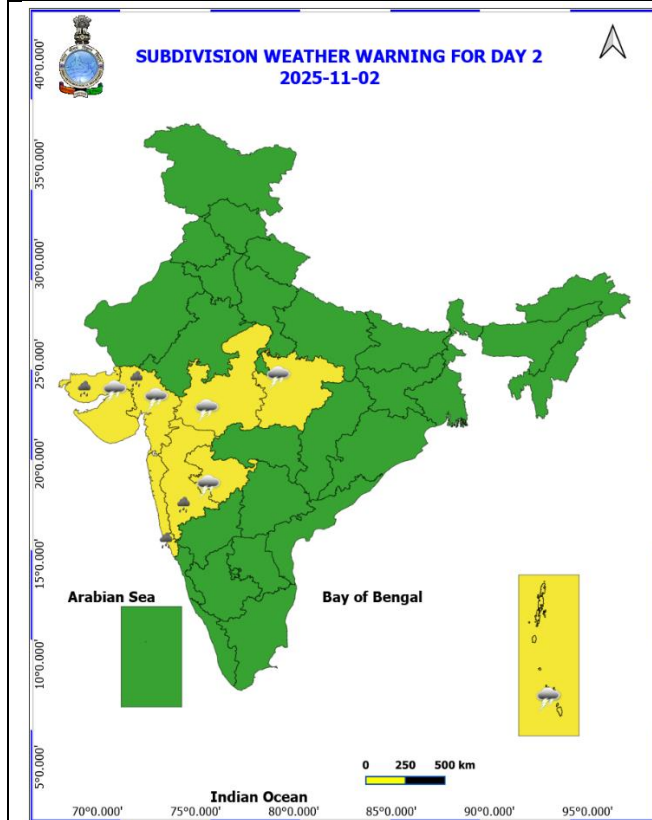

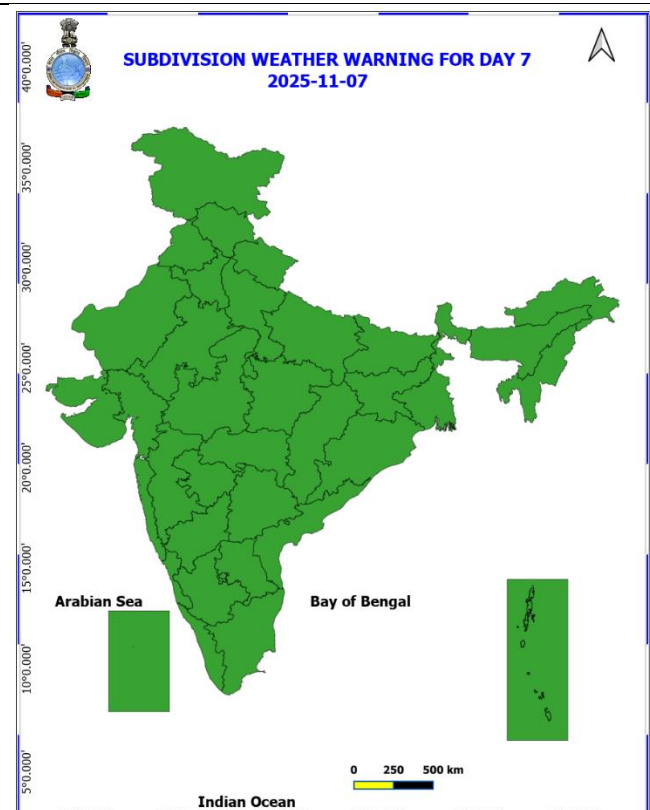
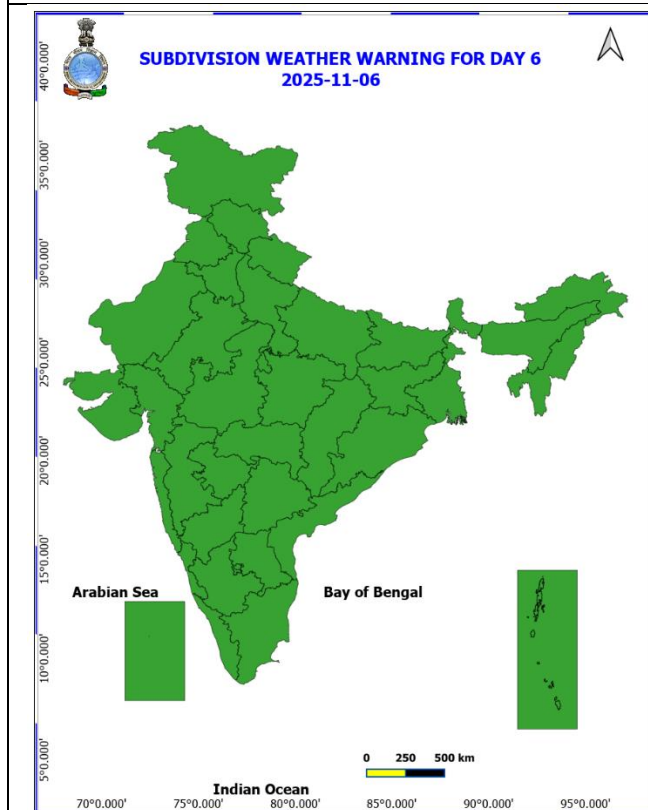

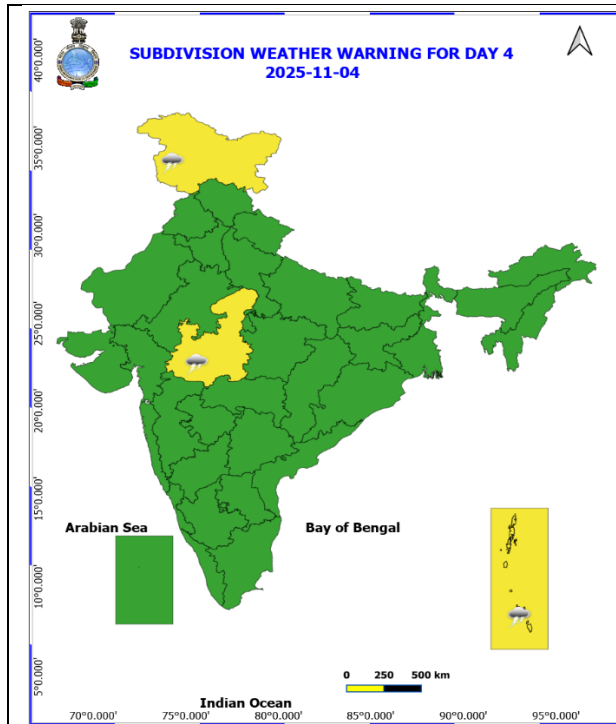
