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Subject: (A) Depression [Remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha"] over south Chhattisgarh & adjoining Vidarbha and (B) Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea

(A) Depression [Remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha"] over south Chhattisgarh & adjoining Vidarbha

The Depression [Remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha"] over south Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood moved north-northwestwards with a speed of 17 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centered at 2330 hrs IST of yesterday, the 29th October 2025 over south Chhattisgarh & adjoining Vidarbha, near latitude 19.6°N & longitude 80.7°E, about 110 km southwest of Kanker (Chhattisgarh), 150km west-northwest of Jagdalpur (Chhattisgarh), 150km east-southeast of Chandrapur (Maharashtra), 160 km northeast of Ramgundam (Telangana) and 240 km southeast of Nagpur (Maharashtra).

It is likely to move nearly northwards across Chhattisgarh & adjoining Vidarbha and weaken into a well marked low pressure area during next 12 hours.

Warning:

(i) Rainfall Warning (Graphics Enclosed):

Andhra Pradesh & Yanam of Puducherry: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at a few places on 29th October. Rainfall activity would reduce on 30th with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places over north Andhra Pradesh.

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places over Odisha on 29th October.

Telangana: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with isolated **heavy to extremely heavy rainfall** on 29th October. Rainfall activity would reduce thereafter with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall at** isolated places likely on 30th October.

Chhattisgarh: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 29th & 30th October.

East Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 29th & 30th October.

Vidarbha: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 29th & 30th October.

Gangetic West Bengal: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places till 31st October.

Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 30th October and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 31st October.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 30th and 31st October.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 30th & 31st October.

(ii) Wind warning (Graphics Enclosed):

❖ **Telangana:** Squally wind speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail till morning of 30th October and decrease thereafter.

❖ **South Chhattisgarh and South interior Odisha:** Squally wind speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail till morning of 30th October and decrease thereafter.

(iii) 24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1130 IST of 30th October is enclosed.

(iv) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain (Telangana, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, south Chhattisgarh & adjoining areas of south Odisha and north Andhra Pradesh)

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches. Damage to banana and papaya trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees.
- ❖ Damage to paddy crops, horticultural and standing crops and orchards due to inundation & winds.
- ❖ Inundation of low-lying areas in coastal districts due to heavy rainfall and flash flood
- ❖ Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.

- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Disruption of traffic due to water logging.
- ❖ Localized Landslides/Mudslides It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action suggested:

- ❖ People in affected areas to remain indoors.
- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly. Do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Surface transport and helicopter services to be regulated.

(B) Depression over Eastcentral Arabian Sea

The Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea remained practically stationary during past 6 hours and lay centered at 2330 hrs IST of yesterday, the 29th October 2025, over the same region, near latitude 17.9°N & longitude 69.0°E, about 360 km south-southwest of Veraval (Gujarat), 430 km west-southwest of Mumbai (Maharashtra) and 580 km west-northwest of Panjim (Goa).

It is likely to move nearly northwestwards across Eastcentral Arabian Sea during next 36 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Marathwada: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy to very rainfall** at isolated places is very likely on 29th October.

Konkan & Goa: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places is very likely on 29th October.

Gujarat region: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy to very rainfall** at isolated places is very likely during 29th October to 1st November.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places during 29th to 31st October. Rainfall activity would decrease thereafter with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st November.

Kerala: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places very likely on 29th October.

(ii) Wind warning:

Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 gusting to 65 kmph prevailing around the system center and continue to prevail over Eastcentral and adjoining Southeast Arabian Sea till 29th October.

Squally weather with wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is very likely to prevail over northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 30th October.

(iii) Sea condition:

Sea Condition is likely to be rough to very rough over Eastcentral Arabian Sea till 30th October. Rough sea Condition is prevailing over northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts and likely to become rough to very rough during 29th to 30th October.

(iv) Fishermen warnings:

Fishermen are advised not to venture into Eastcentral & adjoining northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 30th October.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain and strong winds (Kerala, coastal Karnataka, Konkan & Goa and Gujarat state)

Impact expected:

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches. Strong wind and heavy rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to strong winds and heavy rain.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain.
- ❖ There could be localised flash floods, landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Surface & Helicopter services may be regulated.
- ❖ Small ships & country boats would be affected due to strong wind and heavy rain.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Surface transport and helicopter services to be regulated.

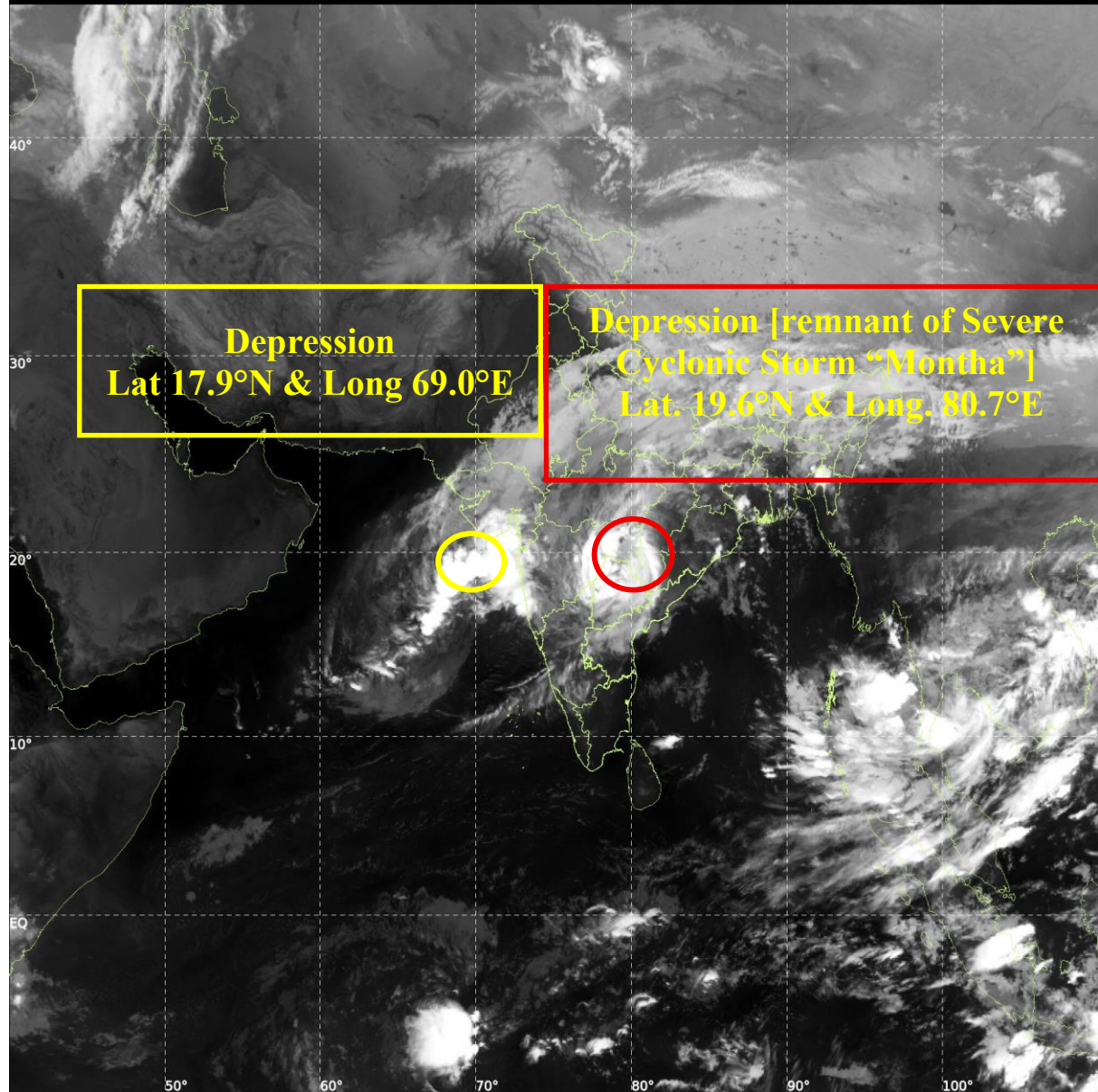

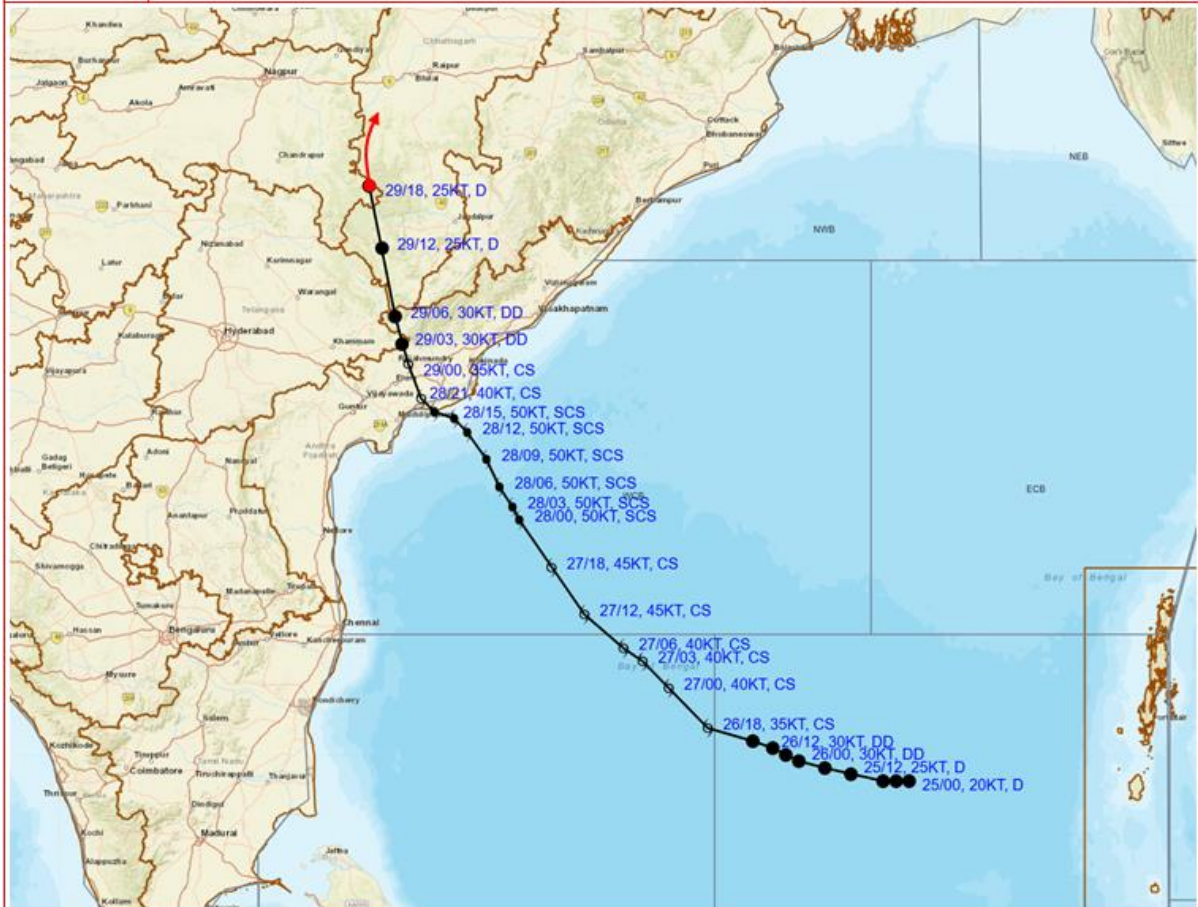

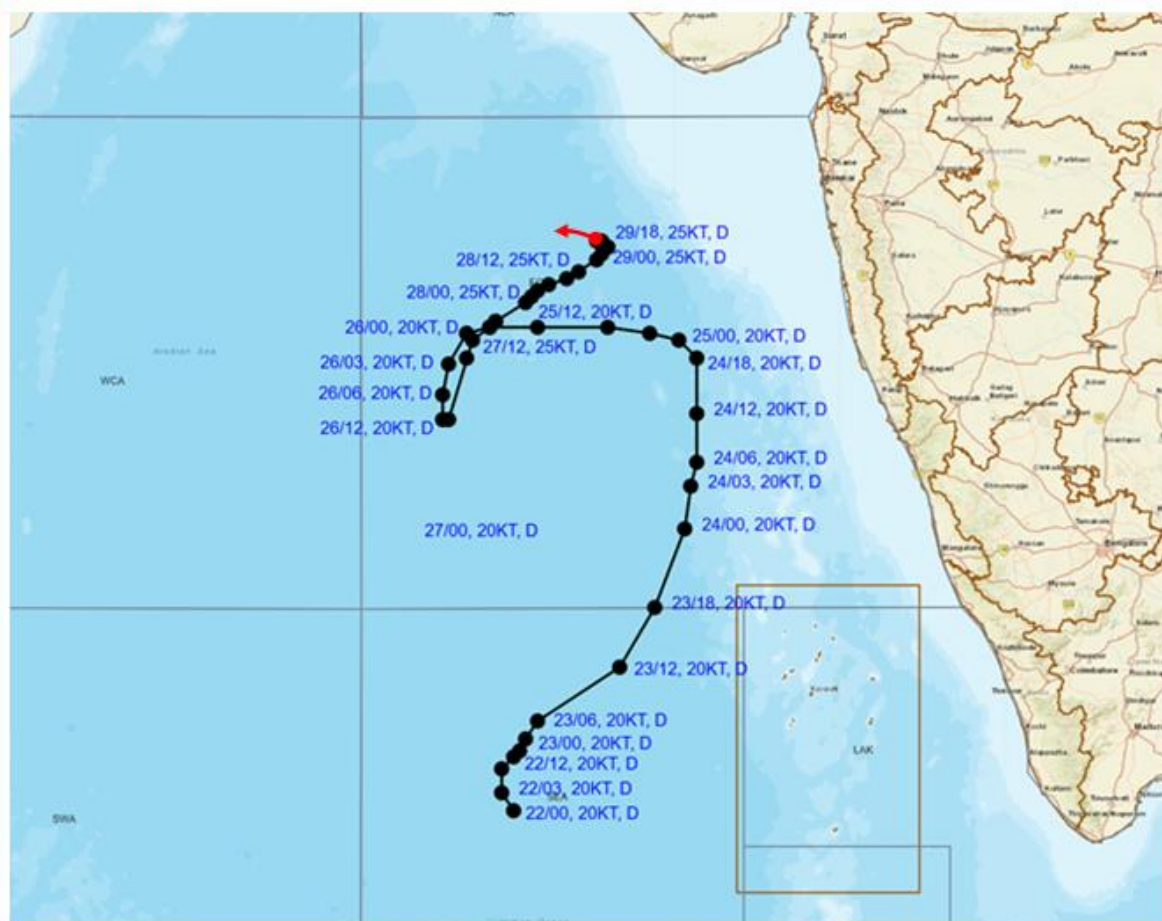

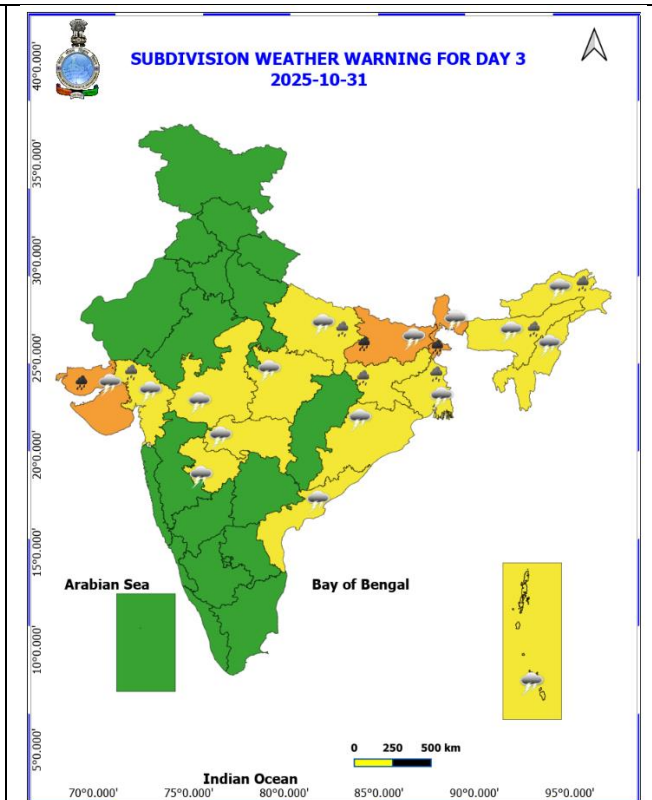

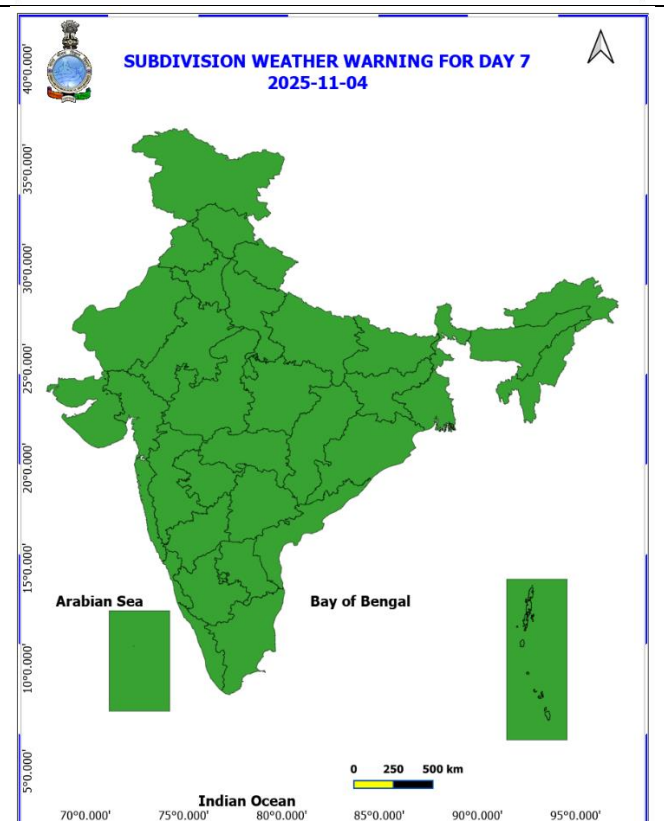

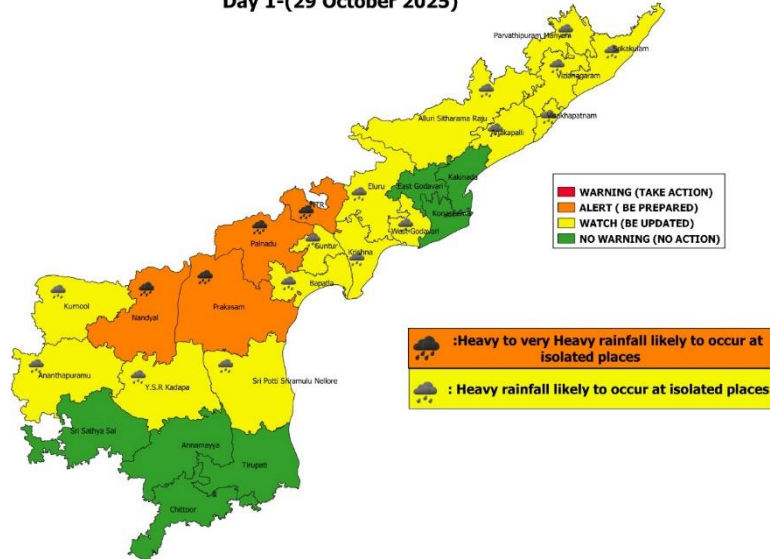

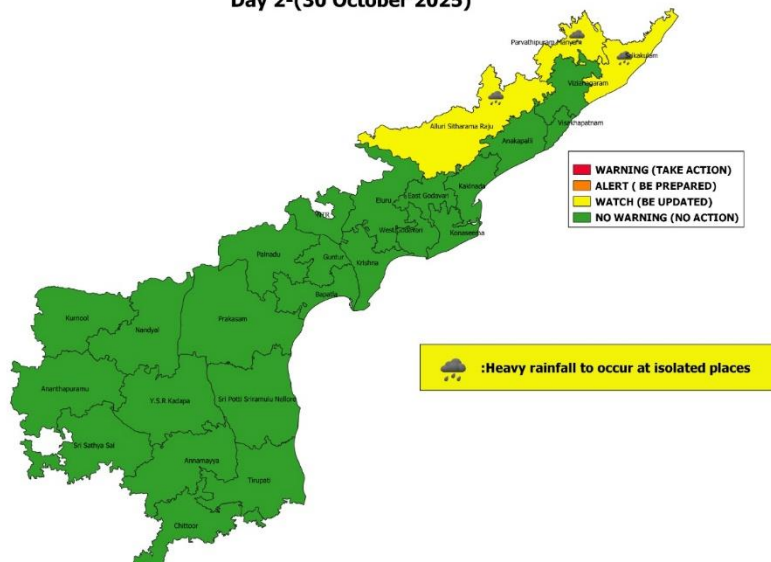

24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1130 IST of today, the 30th October 2025

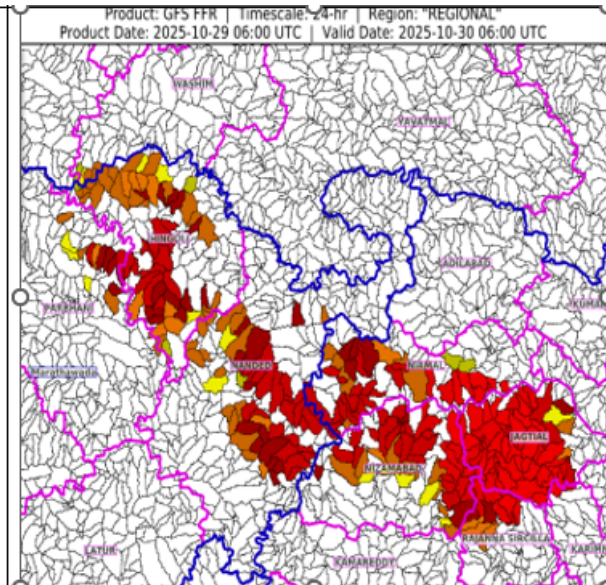
24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1130 IST of 30-10-2025 :

Telangana - Jagtial, Nirmal, Nizamabad and Rajanna Sircilla districts.

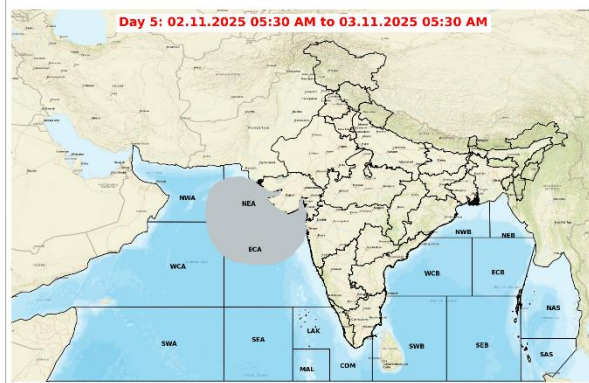
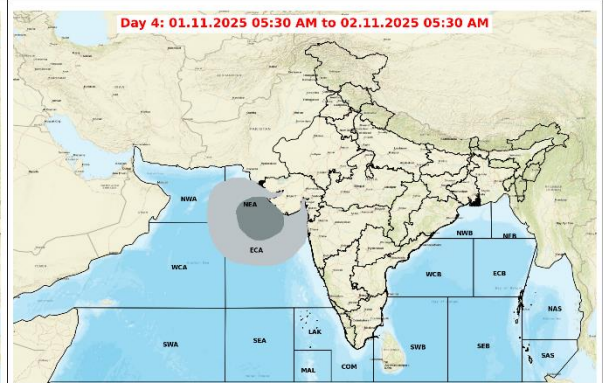
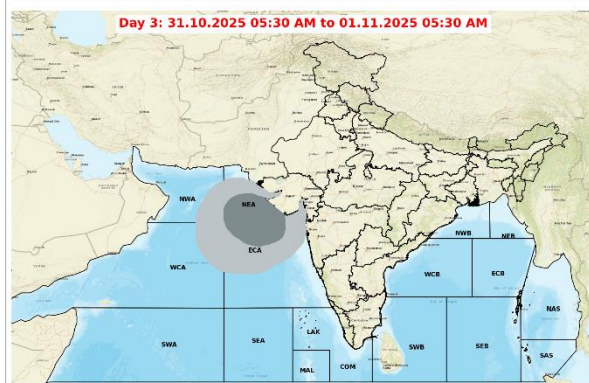
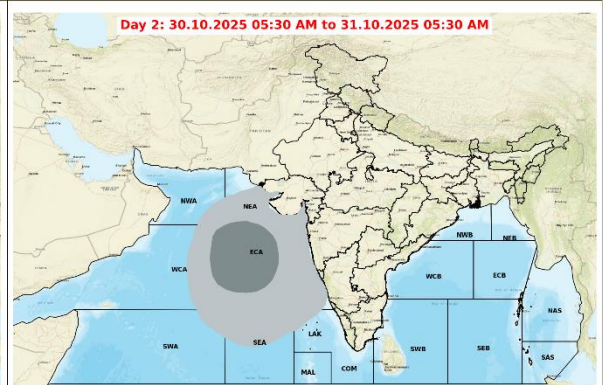
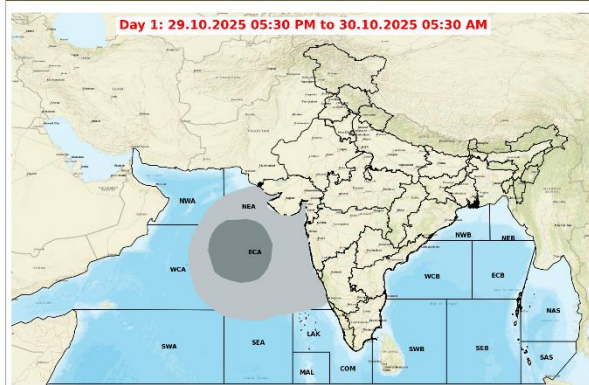
Marathawada - Hingoli, Nanded and Parbhani districts.
