NATIONAL BULLETIN NO. 5 (BoB/02/2026)**

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Subject: Depression over south Jharkhand and adjoining north interior Odisha

The depression over North-interior Odisha & adjoining south Jharkhand moved northwestwards with a speed of 8 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centred at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 6th July 2026, over south Jharkhand and adjoining north interior Odisha near latitude 22.4°N and longitude 85.7°E, close to southwest of Chaibasa (Jharkhand) and about 70 km southwest of Jamshedpur (Jharkhand), 110 km of south-southeast Ranchi (Jharkhand), and 170 km east-southeast of Jashpurnagar (Chhattisgarh).

It is very likely to move nearly northwestwards across Jharkhand & adjoining north Odisha and North Chhattisgarh during next 24 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall (7-20cm) at isolated places on 6th & 7th July and heavy rainfall (7-11cm) at isolated places on 8th July.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very rainfall at isolated places on 6th July and isolated heavy rainfall during 7th – 8th July.

Chhattisgarh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall (**≥ 21 cm**) at isolated places on 6th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th & 8th July.

Gangetic West Bengal: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th July.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th July.

Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 6th to 8th July; heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th July.

East Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 6th to 9th July.

West Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th & 8th July.

Madhya Maharashtra: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th July; heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th & 9th July.

Marathwada: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th July.

Vidarbha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places 6th & 7th July.

Gujarat region: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th to 7th July; heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th July.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th & 7th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th & 9th July.

East Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th to 9th July.

West Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places 9th July.

(ii) Wind Warning:

- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail over northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off north Odisha-West Bengal coasts till evening of 6th July. Thereafter, it is likely to decrease gradually over the same region becoming 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph till 7th July.
- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail over central and northeast Bay of Bengal till evening of 6th July.
- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail over north interior north Odisha & adjoining south Jharkhand and north Chhattisgarh till morning of 7th July and decrease gradually thereafter.

(iii) Sea Condition:

- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough** over northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off north Odisha-West Bengal coasts till 7th July and improve gradually thereafter.
- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be moderate to rough** over central and northeast Bay of Bengal till evening of 6th July and improve gradually thereafter.

(iv) Fishermen Warning (Graphics Attached):

- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off Odisha, and West Bengal coasts till 7th July.
- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into central and northeast Bay of Bengal till evening of today, the 6th July 2026.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall and squally winds

Impact expected:

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- ❖ There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- ❖ Helicopter services to be regulated.

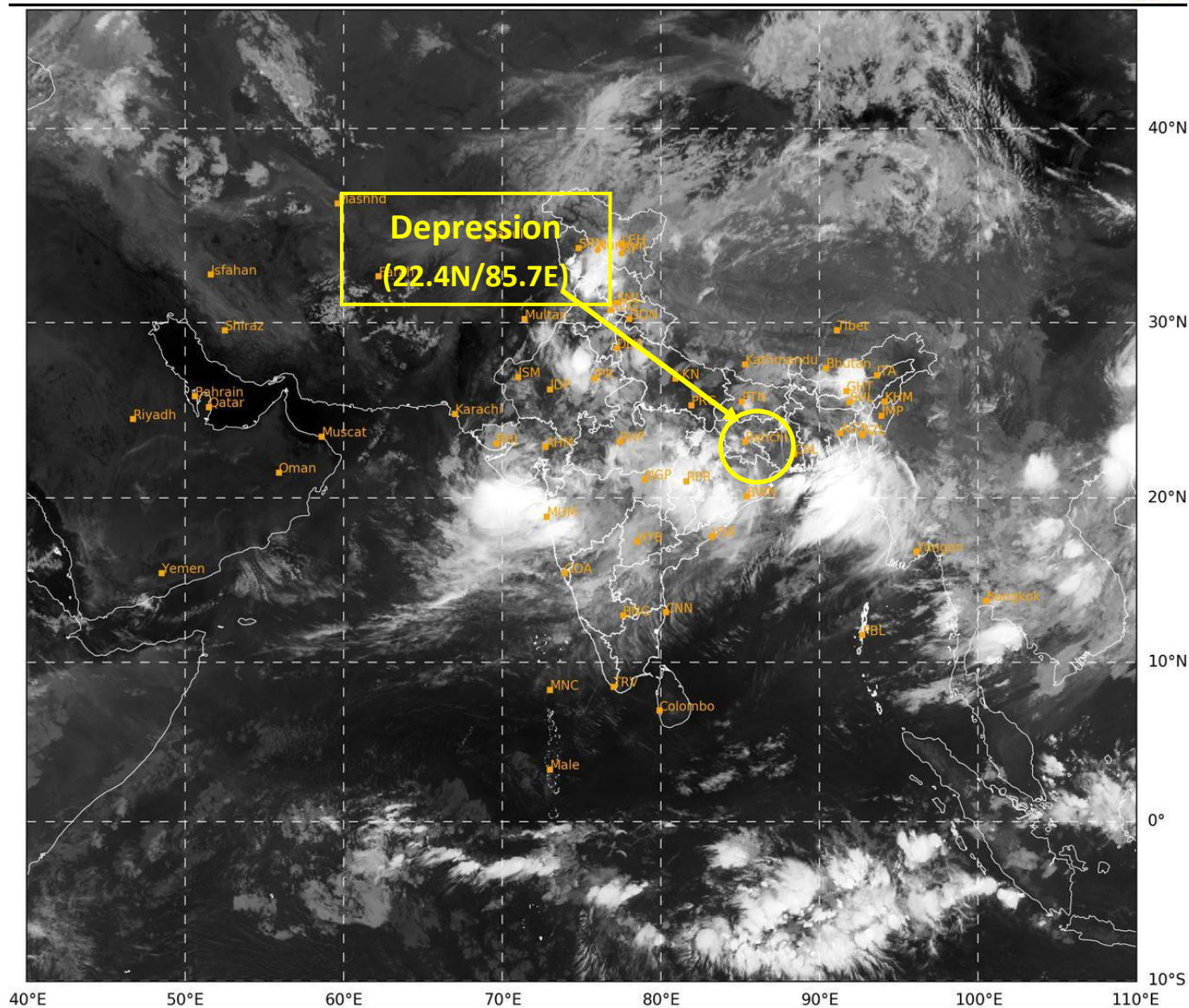

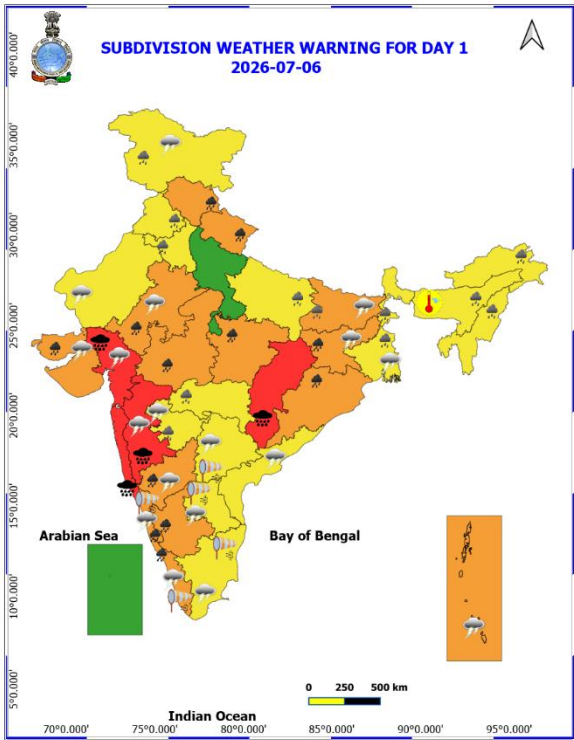

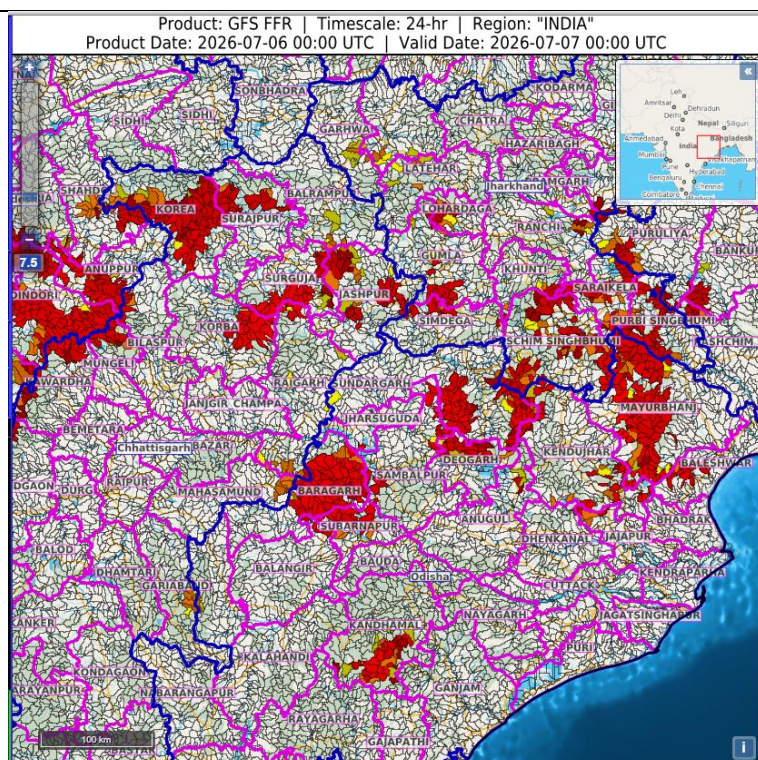
Flash Flood Guidance

24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 0530 IST of 07-07-2026 :

Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

Chhattisgarh - Jashpur, Surguja, Surajpur, Korea, Korba, Bilaspur, Mahasamund, districts.
Odisha - Balangir, Baleshwar, Baragarh, Deogarh, Jharsuguda, Kendujhar, Mayurbhanj, Nuaparha, Sambalpur, Subarnapur and Sundargarh districts.

Surface runoff/ Inundation may occur at some fully saturated soils & low-lying areas over Area of Concern (AoC) as shown in map due to expected rainfall occurrence in next 24 hours.



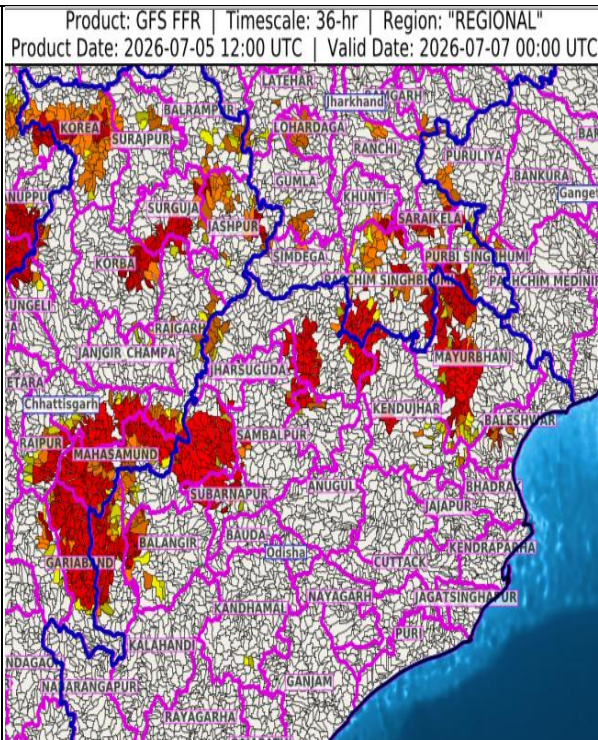
24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1730 IST of 06-07-2026 :

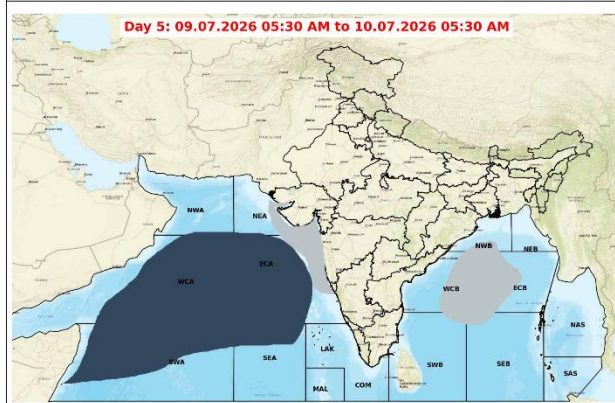
