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Subject: Deep Depression over northwest Bay of Bengal and close to West Bengal coast

The Deep Depression over northwest Bay of Bengal and adjoining areas of West Bengal-North Odisha coasts moved slowly west-northwestwards with the speed of 7 kmph during past 6 hours and lay centred at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 27th July 2026, over northwest Bay of Bengal close to West Bengal coast near latitude 21.6°N and longitude 87.7°E, about 20 km east of Digha (West Bengal), 20 km south-southwest of Contai, 40 km west of Sagar Island (West Bengal), 60 km southwest of Haldia (West Bengal), 80 km east of Balasore (Odisha) and 120 km southwest of Canning (West Bengal).

It is very likely to move nearly west-northwestwards and cross West Bengal-North Odisha coasts close to east of Digha and west of Haldia by early morning of tomorrow, the 28th July 2026.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at a few places and very heavy to extremely heavy rainfall (**≥ 21 cm**) at isolated places on 27th July and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 28th July.

Chhattisgarh Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at a few places and very heavy to extremely heavy rainfall (**≥ 21 cm**) at isolated places on 27th July and

heavy to very heavy rainfall & 28th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 29th to 31st July.

Gangetic West Bengal: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 27th and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 28th July.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 27th and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 28th July.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 27th, 29th & 30th July.

East Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 27th, 28th & 31st July and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 29th & 30th July.

West Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places during 28th - 31st July and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 29th July.

East Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 27th & 29th July and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 28th July.

West Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 27th & 30th July with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 28th - 29th July.

(ii) Wind Warning:

- ❖ Squally winds with speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is likely to prevail over Northwest Bay of Bengal & adjoining Odisha-West Bengal-north Andhra Pradesh coasts till morning of 28th July and decrease gradually thereafter.
- ❖ Squally winds with speed reaching 40-50 gusting to 60 kmph are likely to prevail over central and northeast Bay of Bengal during 27th - 28th July.

(iii) Sea Condition:

- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough to very rough** over northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Odisha, West Bengal & north Andhra Pradesh coasts till morning of 28th July and thereafter rough over the same region on 28th July. It is likely to improve gradually thereafter.
- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough** over central and northeast Bay of Bengal till 28th July and improve gradually thereafter.

(iv) Fishermen Warning (Graphics Attached):

- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Odisha, West Bengal & north Andhra Pradesh coasts till morning of 29th July.
- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into central and northeast Bay of Bengal during till 28th July.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall and squally winds

Impact expected:

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Loose objects may fly.
- ❖ Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- ❖ There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- ❖ Helicopter services to be regulated.

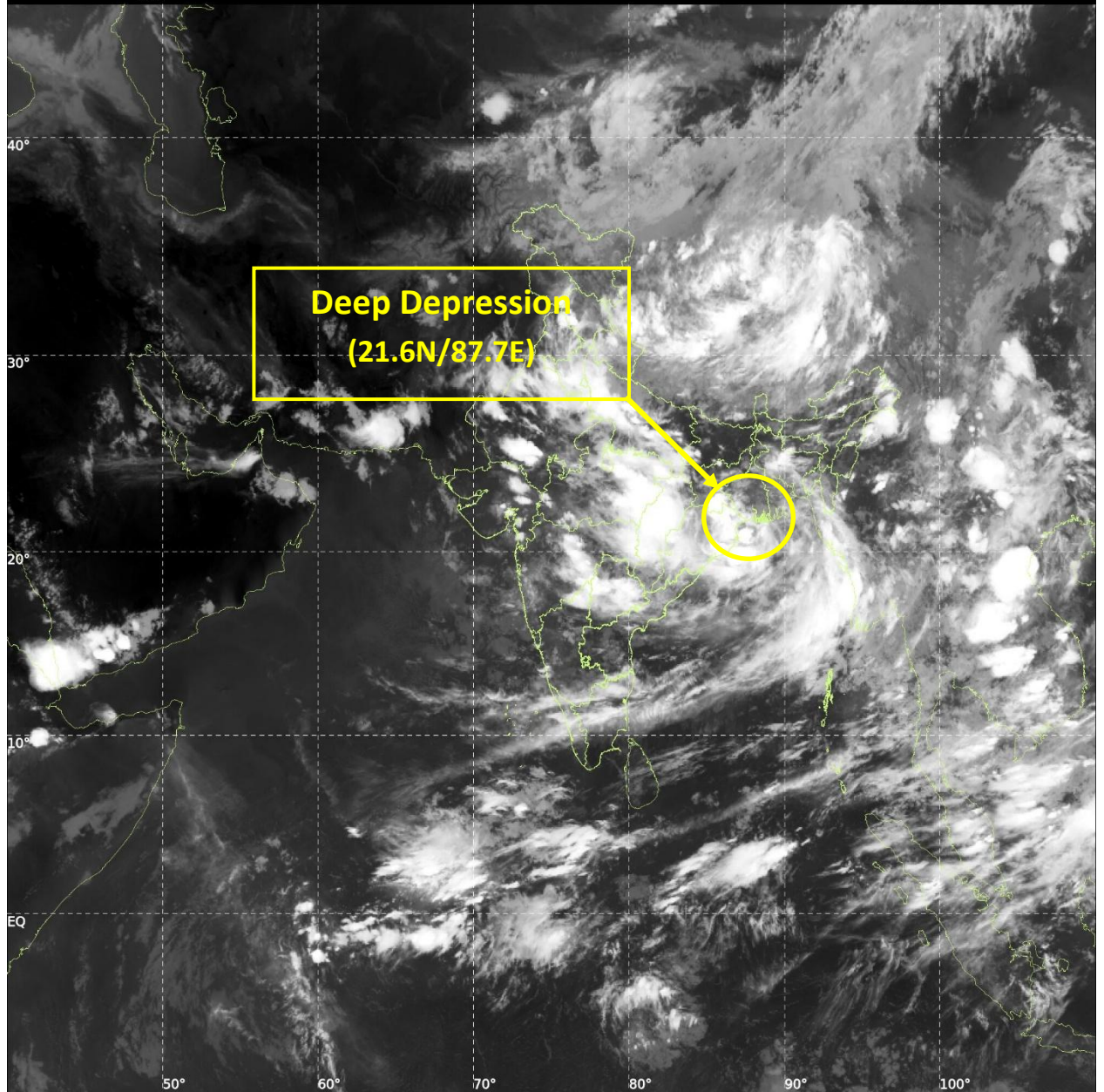

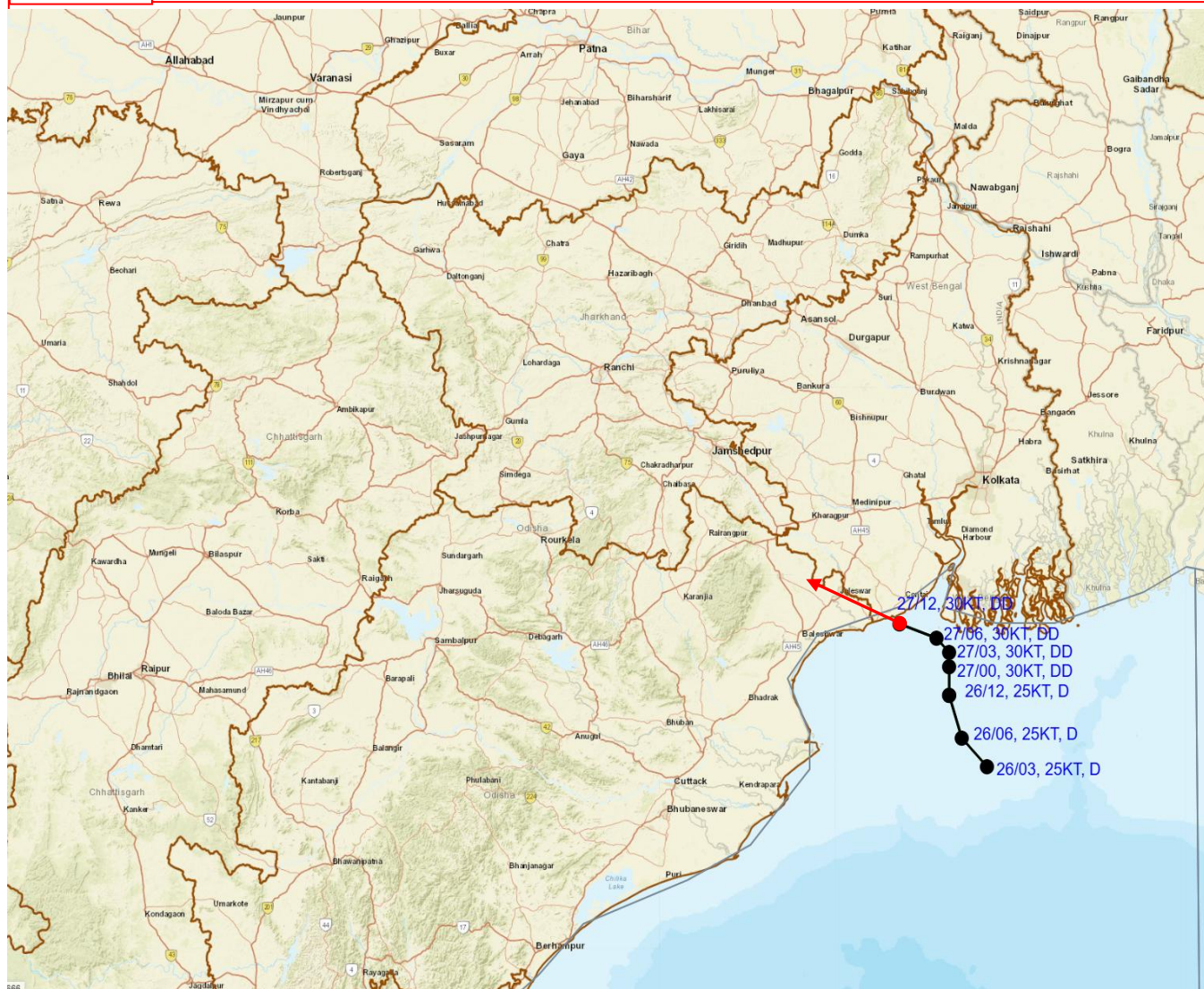

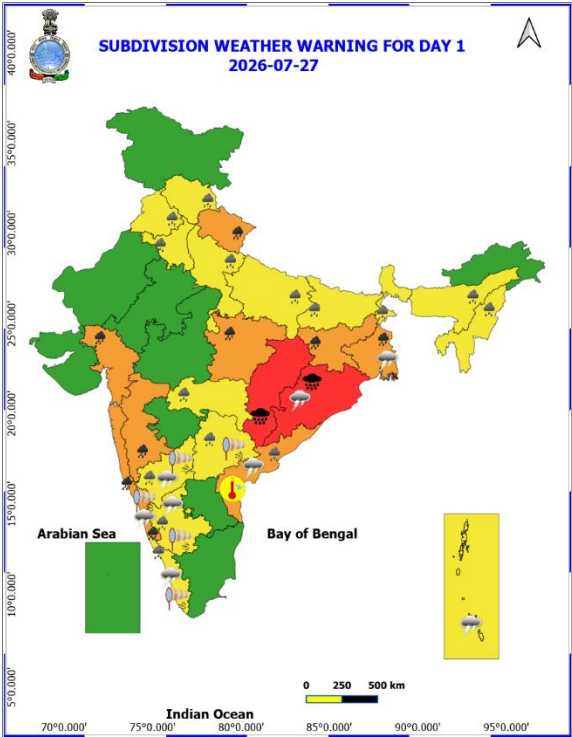

Flash Flood Guidance

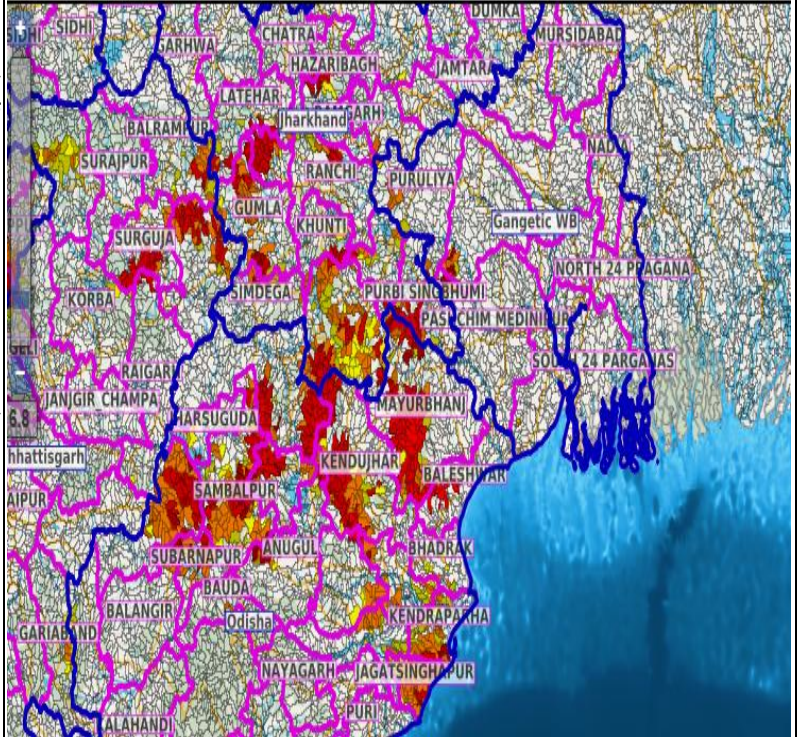
24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1730 IST of 28-07-2026 :

Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

Chhattisgarh - Balrampur, Jashpur, Koriya and Surguja districts.
Odisha - Angul, Balasore, Bargarh, Bhadrak, Deogarh, Dhenkanal, Jagatsinghpur, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Nawarangpur and Sonepur districts.
Jharkhand - East Singhbhum, Gumla, Hazaribag, Khunti, Lohardaga, Ranchi, Seraikela-Kharsawan, Simdega and West Singhbhum districts.

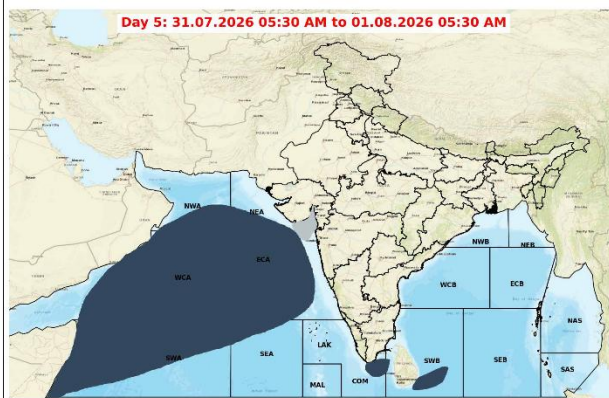
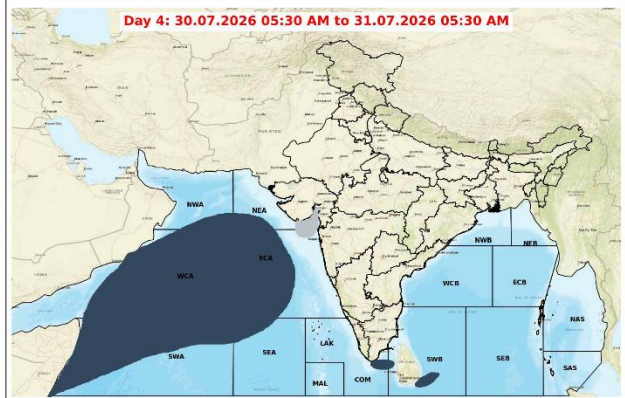
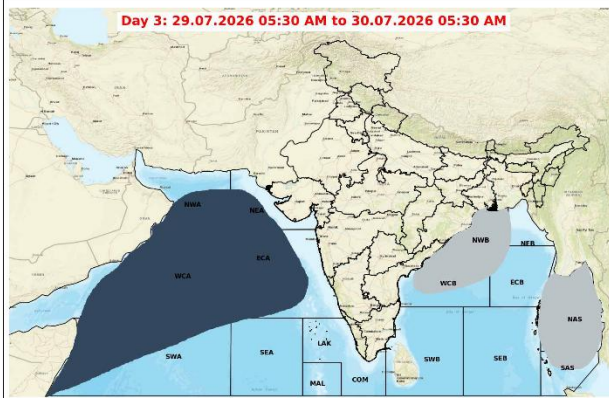
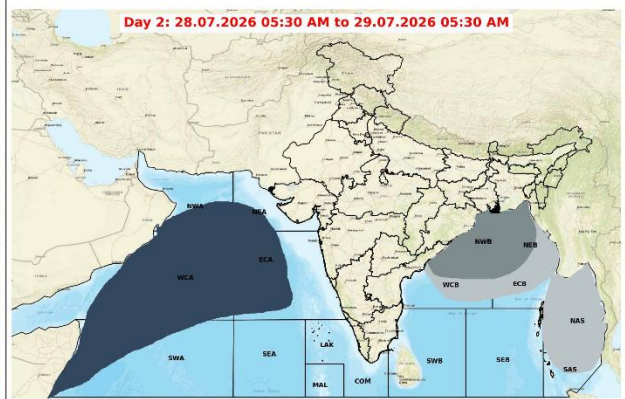
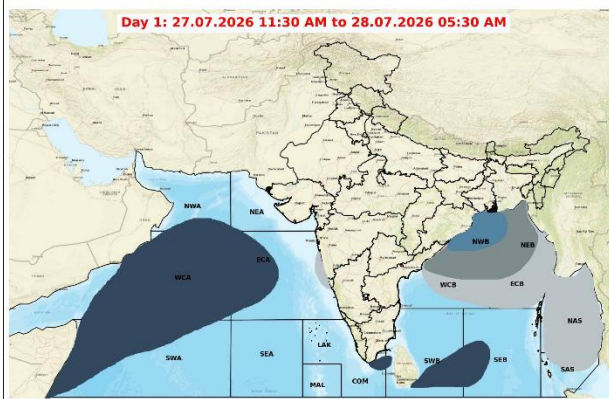
