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Subject: (A) Low Pressure area over southwest Bihar & adjoining Jharkhand and (B) Depression over Eastcentral Arabian Sea

(A) Low Pressure area over southwest Bihar & adjoining Jharkhand

The Well Marked Low Pressure Area [Remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha"] over northwest Jharkhand & neighbourhood moved slowly north-northeastwards during past 6 hours, weakened into a **Low Pressure Area** and lay over southwest Bihar & adjoining Jharkhand at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 31st October 2025.

It is likely to continue to move north-northeastwards towards Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Assam during next 12 hours and become insignificant during subsequent 24 hours.

This is the last update in association with the low pressure area (remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha") of over southwest Bihar & adjoining Jharkhand. However, regular bulletins/messages will continue in this regard from National Weather Forecasting Center/ Regional Meteorological Centers/ Meteorological Centers.

Warning:

(i) Rainfall Warning (Graphics Enclosed):

Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with **heavy to extremely heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October. Thereafter rainfall activity would decrease with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places likely on 1st November.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with isolated **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October. Thereafter rainfall activity would decrease with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places likely on 1st November.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October.

Assam: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October.

Arunachal Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st November.

(ii) Wind Warning:

Strong and squally wind with speed reaching 15-25 kmph gusting to 35 kmph is likely to prevail over Bihar and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during next 24 hours.

(iii) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain

(Bihar and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh)

- ❖ Damage to paddy crops, horticultural and standing crops and orchards due to inundation and strong wind.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Disruption of traffic due to water logging.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly. Do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

(B) Depression over Eastcentral Arabian Sea

The Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea moved slowly east-northeastwards with a speed of 10 kmph during past 6 hours and lay centered at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 31st October 2025, over the same region, near latitude 19.2°N & longitude 69.0°E, about 240 km southwest of Veraval (Gujarat), 260 km southwest of Diu, 400 km west of Mumbai (Maharashtra) and 660 km west-northwest of Panjim (Goa).

It is likely to move nearly northeastwards towards Gujarat coast across northeast Arabian Sea and weaken into a Well-Marked Low Pressure Area during next 24 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Gujarat region: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places is very likely on 31st October and 1st November.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October and 1st November.

North Konkan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October and 1st November.

Wind warning:

Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Eastcentral & northeast Arabian Sea around the system center and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 31st October. It would decrease becoming 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph till 1st November.

(ii) Sea condition:

Sea Condition is likely to be rough to very rough over Eastcentral and northeast Arabian Sea & along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 1st November.

(iii) Fishermen warnings:

Fishermen are advised not to venture into Eastcentral & northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 1st November.

(iv) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain and strong winds (North Konkan and coastal districts of Gujarat state)

Impact expected:

- ❖ Strong - squally wind and heavy rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to strong winds and heavy rain.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain.
- ❖ There could be localised flash floods, landslides/mudslides/landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Surface & Helicopter services may be regulated.
- ❖ Small ships & country boats would be affected due to strong wind and heavy rain.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Surface transport and helicopter services to be regulated.

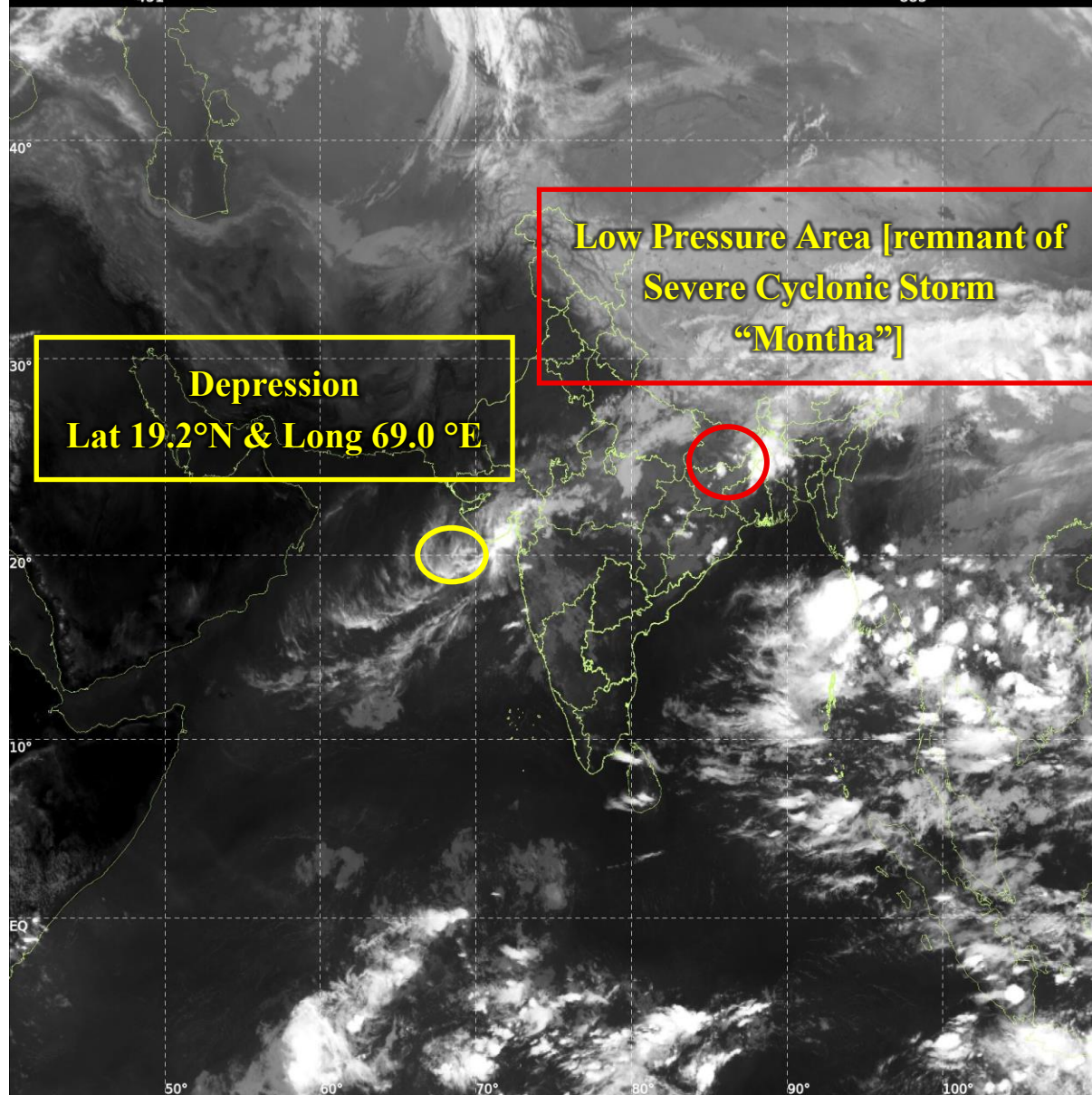

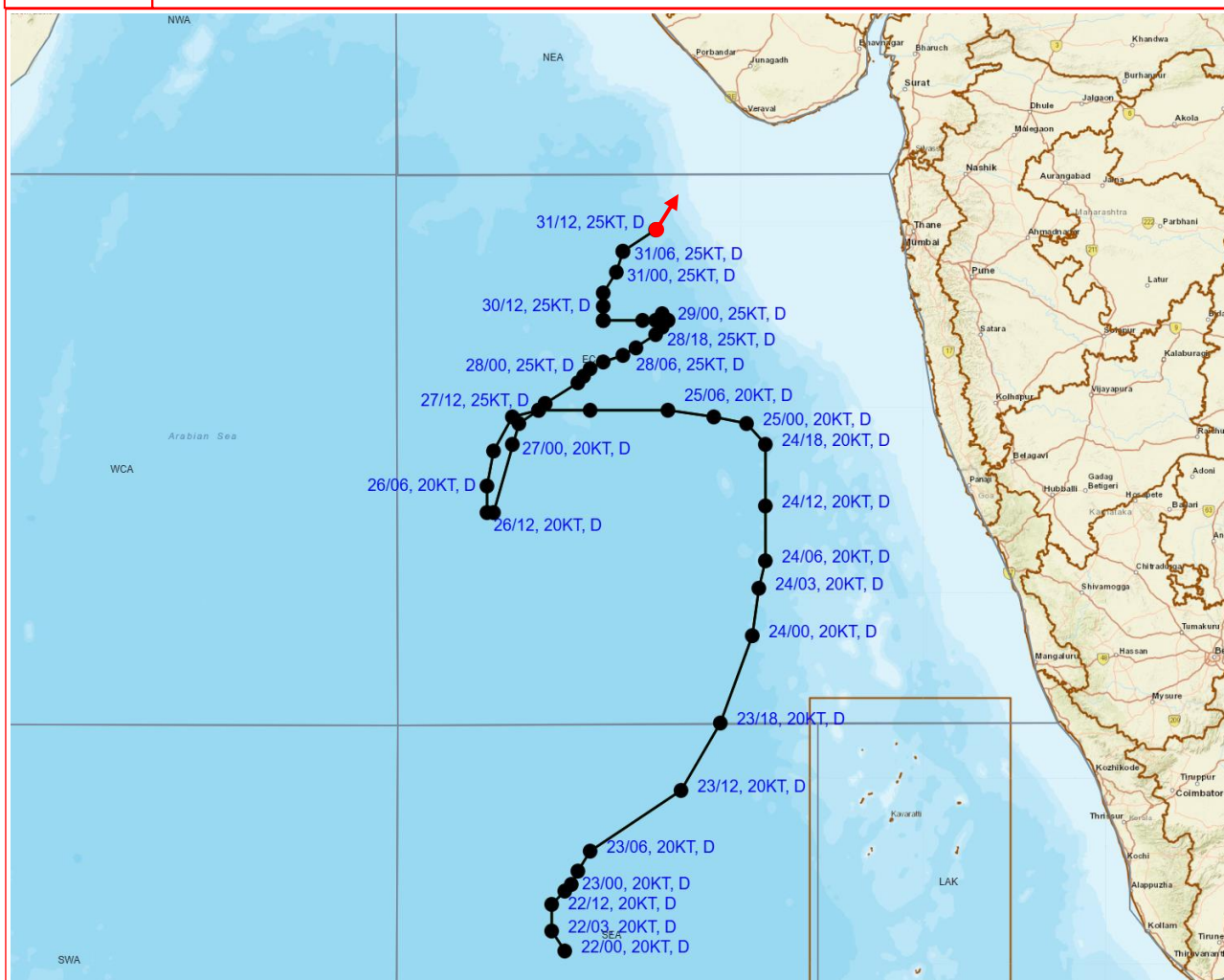

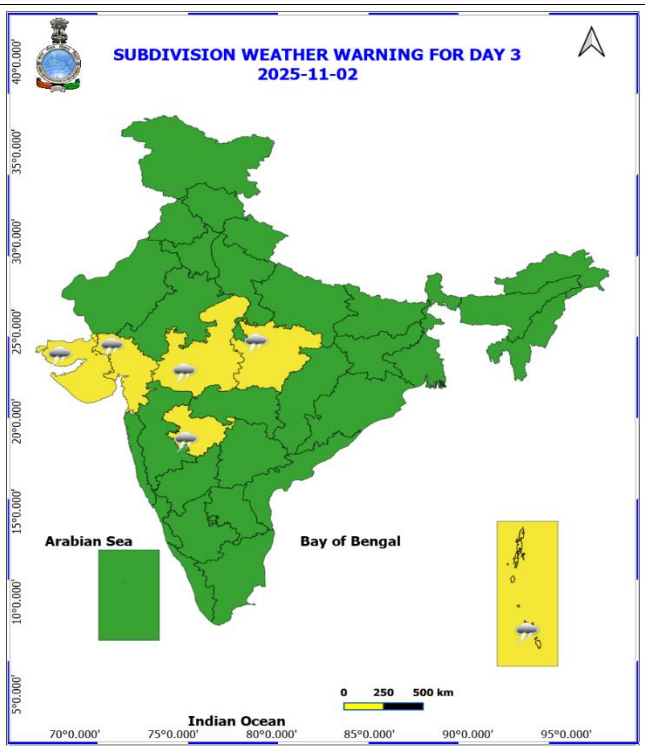

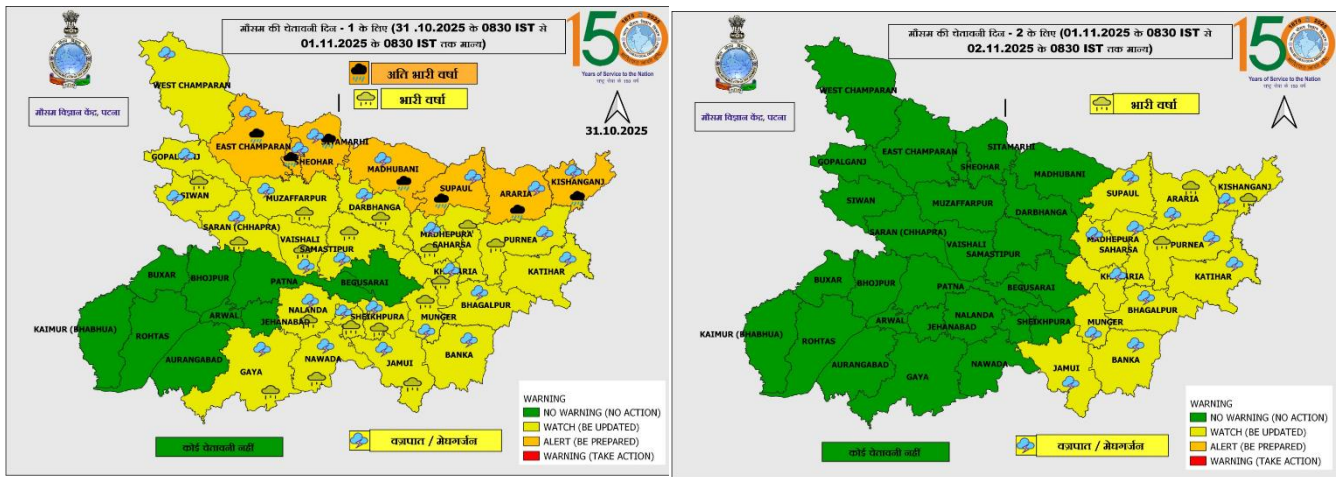

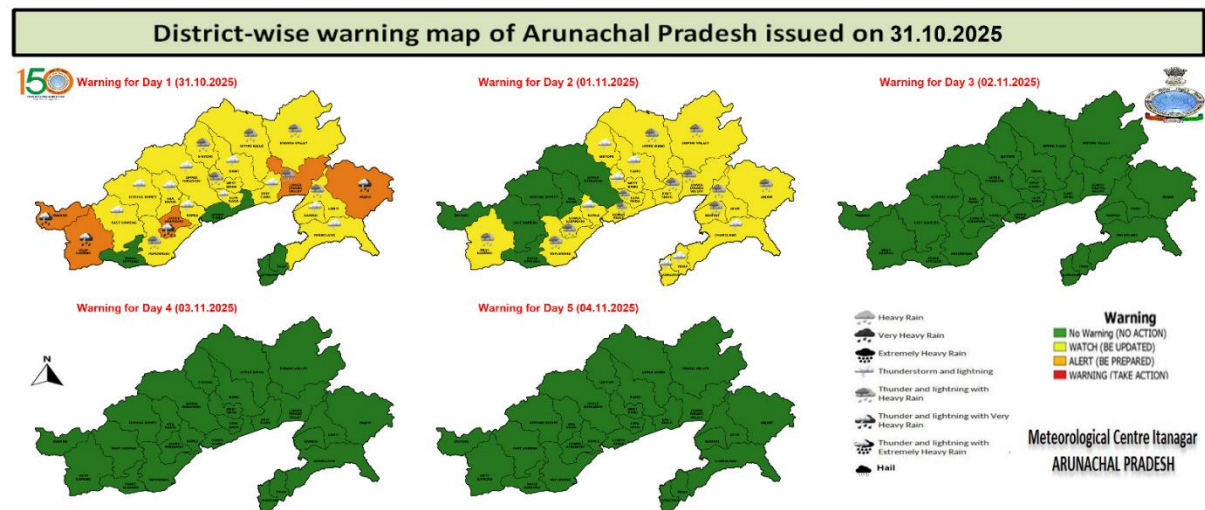




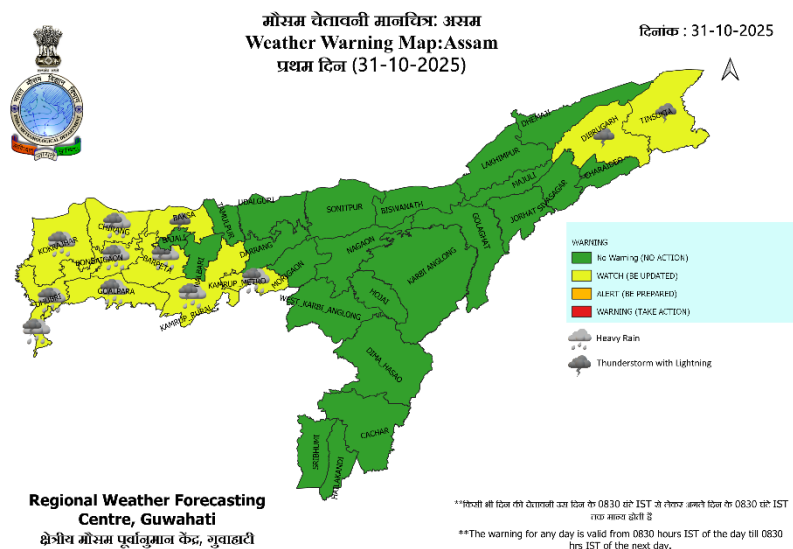
District-wise Rainfall Warning on Bihar



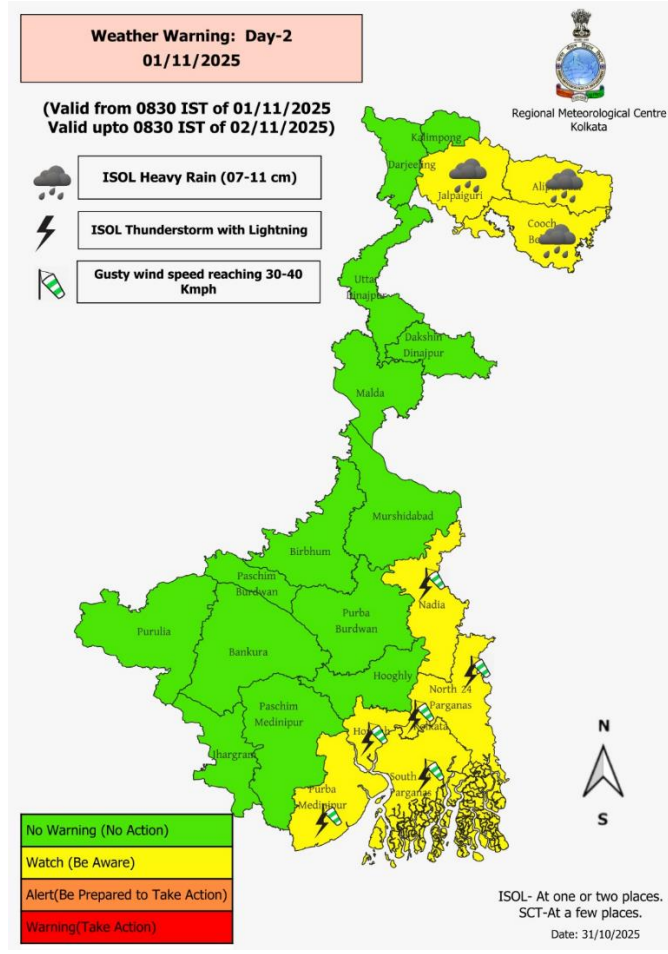
District-wise Rainfall Warning on Arunachal Pradesh



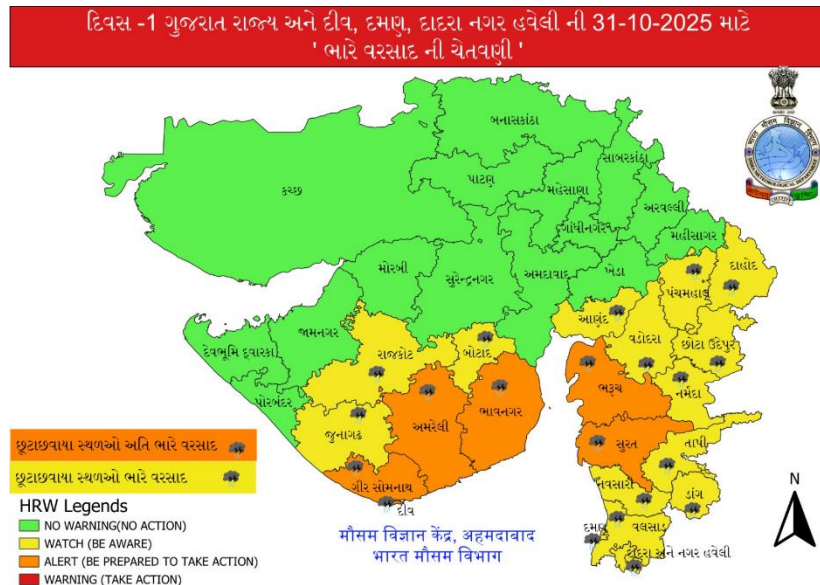
District-wise Rainfall Warning on Assam



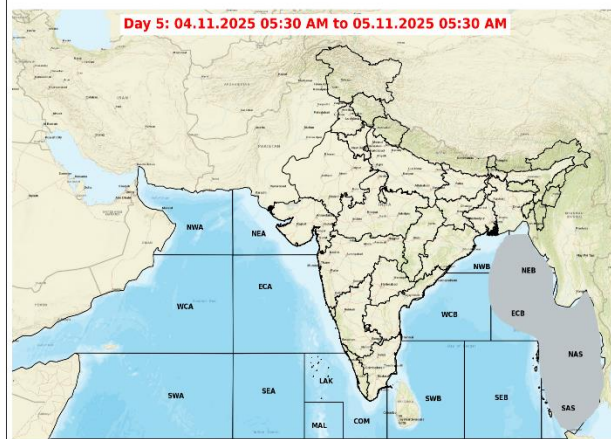
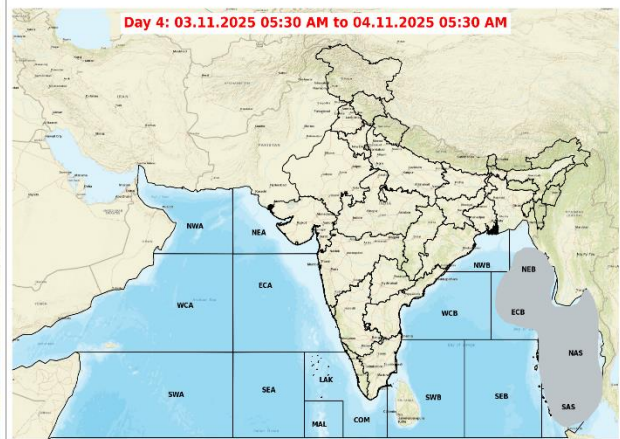
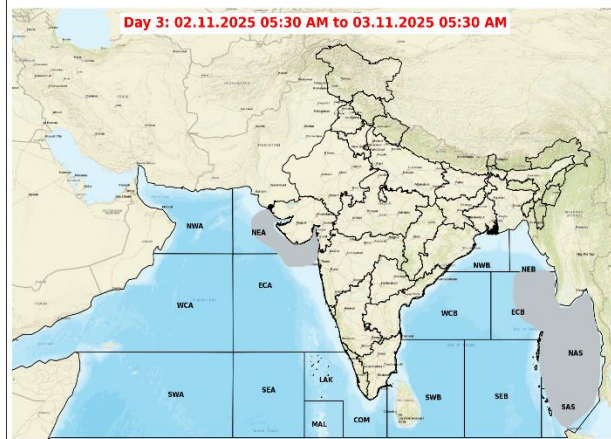
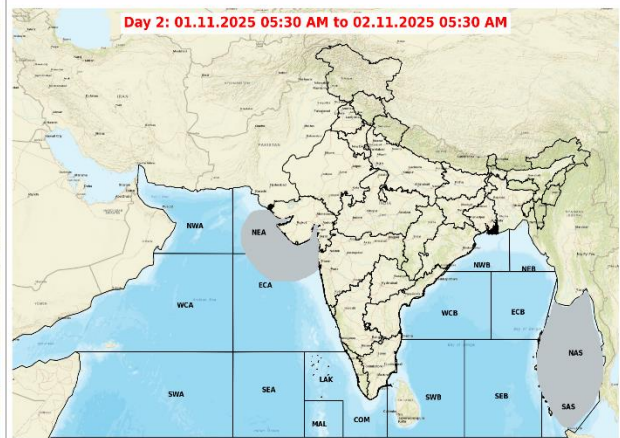
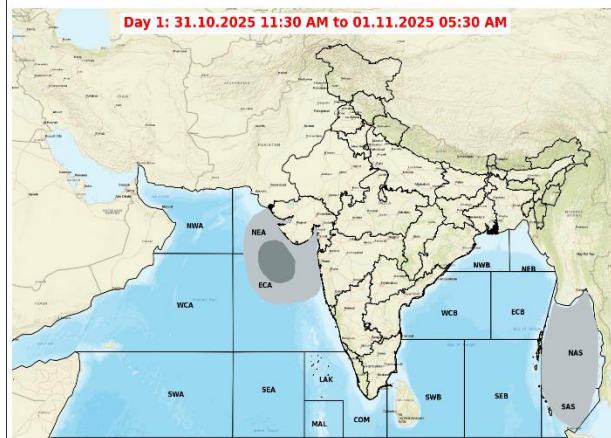
District-wise Rainfall Warning on West Bengal
