Subject: (A) Well Marked Low Pressure area over central Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood (B) Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea

(A) Well Marked Low Pressure area over central Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood

The Well Marked Low Pressure Area [Remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha"] over northeast Vidarbha and adjoining areas of south Chhattisgarh & east Madhya Pradesh moved nearly north-northeastwards and lay over central Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 30th October 2025.

It is likely to move nearly northwards across north Chhattisgarh and weaken into a low pressure area during next 24 hours.

Warning:

(i) Rainfall Warning (Graphics Enclosed):

Chhattisgarh & East Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 30th October.

Vidarbha: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at most places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 30th October.

Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 30th October & 01st November and **heavy to extremely heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 30th and 31st October.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with isolated **heavy rainfall** on 30th and **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October.

(ii) Wind Warning:

Strong and squally wind with speed reaching 25-25 kmph gusting to 45 kmph is likely to prevail over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, East Vidarbha, northern parts of Telangana and adjoining western Odisha during next 24 hours.

(iii) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain (East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, south Chhattisgarh & adjoining areas of south Odisha)

- ❖ Damage to paddy crops, horticultural and standing crops and orchards due to inundation & winds.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Disruption of traffic due to water logging.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly. Do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

(B) Depression over Eastcentral Arabian Sea

The Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea moved slowly northwards during past 6 hours with a speed of 3 kmph and lay centered at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 30th October 2025, over the same region, near latitude 18.1°N & longitude 68.2°E, about 390 km southwest of Veraval (Gujarat), 500 km west-southwest of Mumbai (Maharashtra) and 670 km west-northwest of Panjim (Goa).

It is likely to move nearly north-northwestwards across Eastcentral Arabian Sea during next 36 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Gujarat region: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places is very likely during 30th October to 1st November.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places during 30th to 31st October. Rainfall activity would decrease thereafter with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st November.

(ii) Wind warning:

Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail around the system center over Eastcentral Arabian Sea till 31st October.

Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is very likely to prevail over northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 31st October.

(iii) Sea condition:

Sea Condition is likely to be rough to very rough over Eastcentral and northeast Arabian Sea & along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 31st October.

Rough sea Condition is prevailing over northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts and likely to become rough to very rough on 30th October.

(iv) Fishermen warnings:

Fishermen are advised not to venture into Eastcentral & northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 31st October.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain and strong winds (North Konkan and coastal districts of Gujarat state)

Impact expected:

- ❖ Strong and squally wind and heavy rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to strong winds and heavy rain.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain.
- ❖ There could be localised flash floods, landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Surface & Helicopter services may be regulated.
- ❖ Small ships & country boats would be affected due to strong wind and heavy rain.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Surface transport and helicopter services to be regulated.

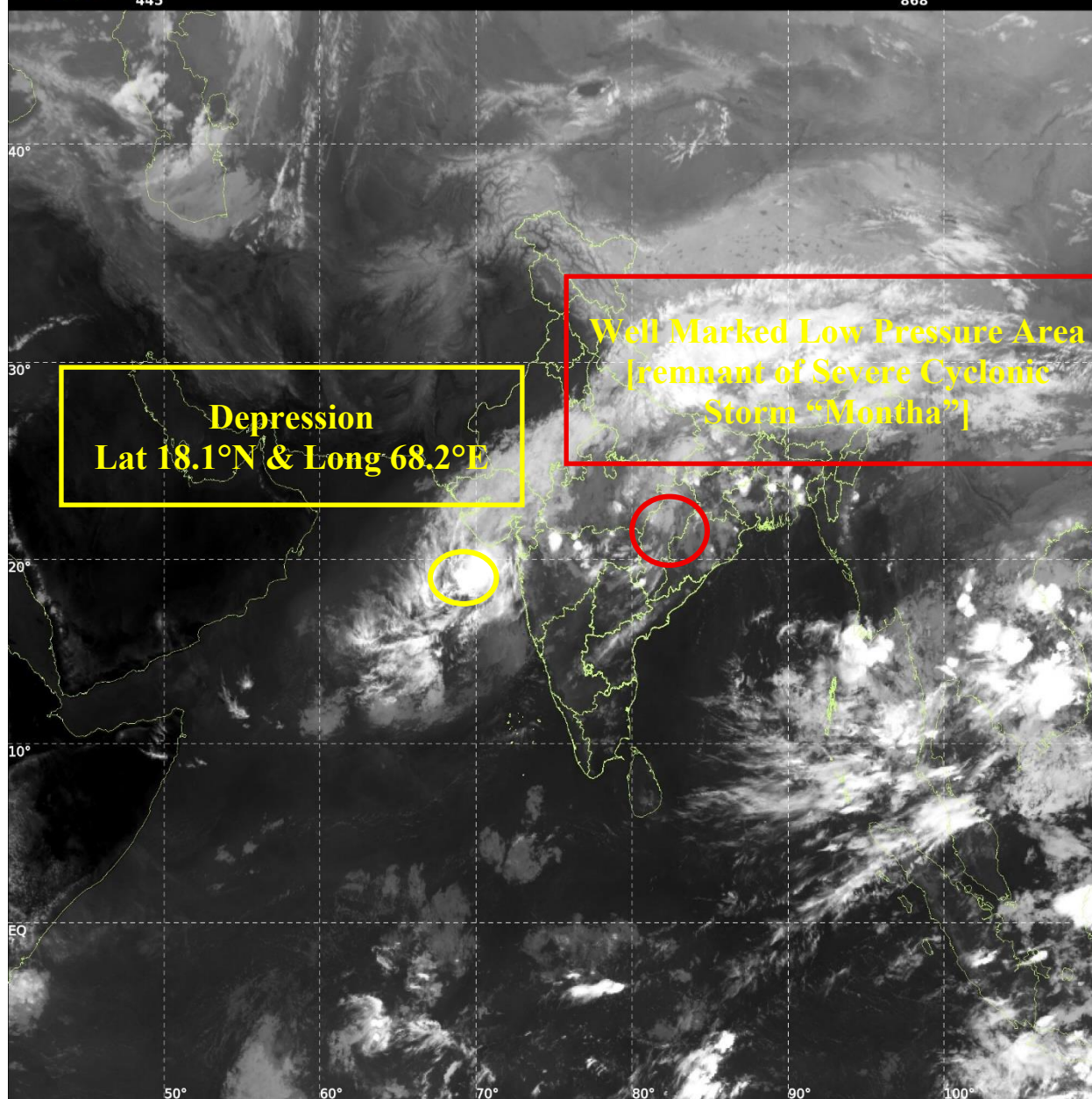

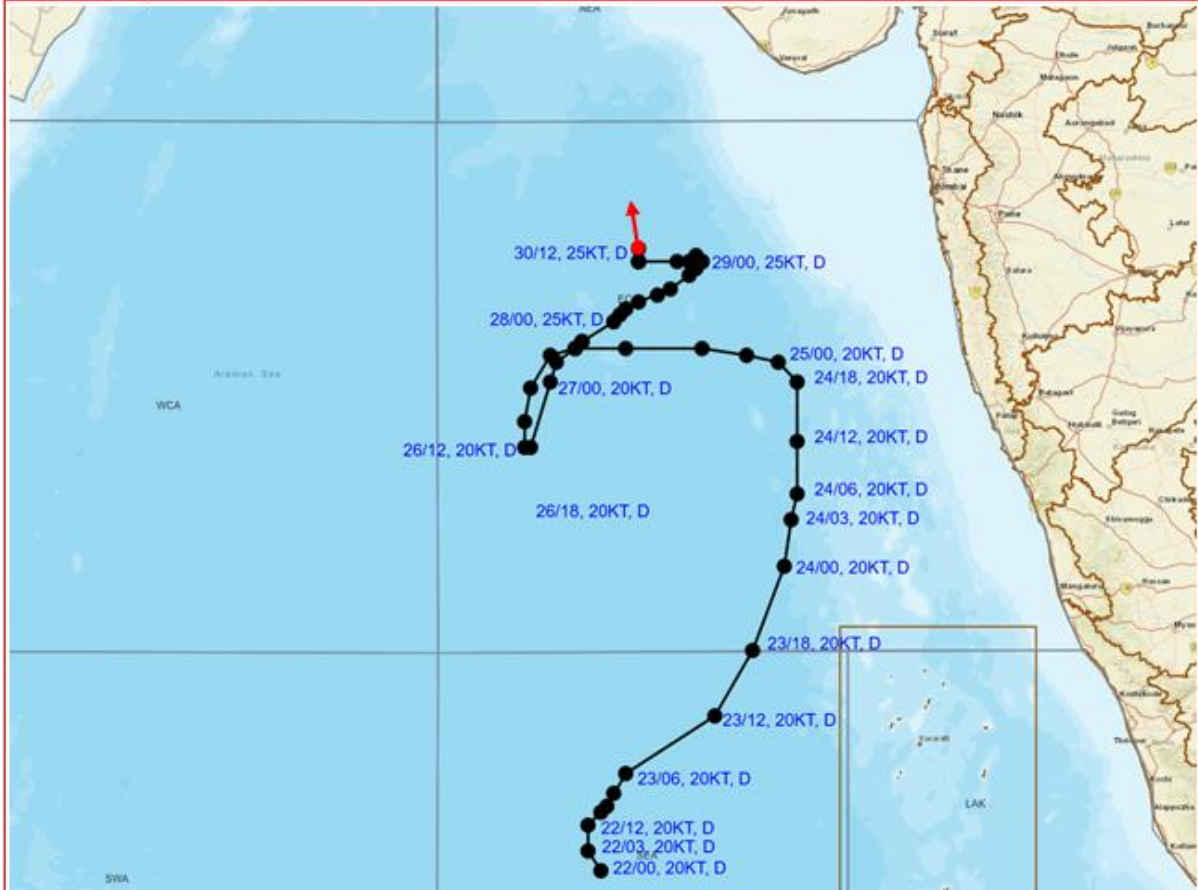

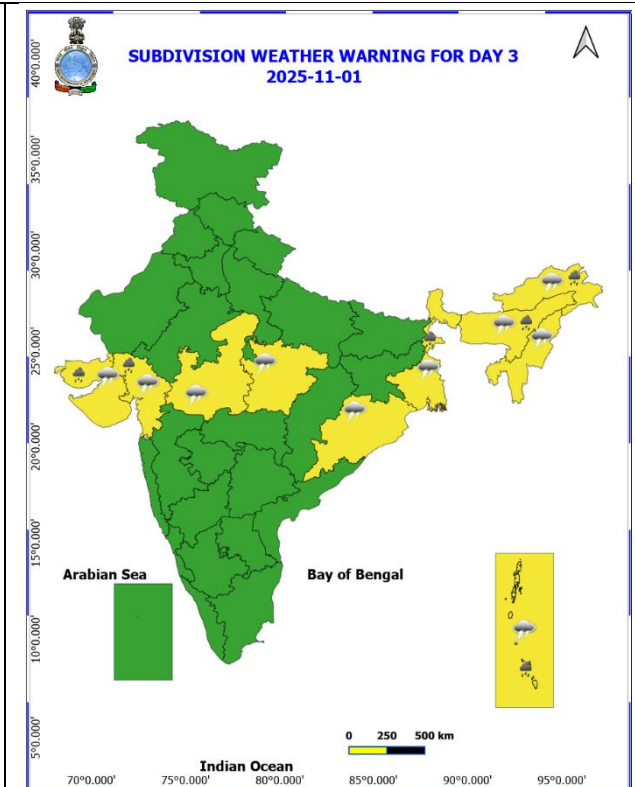

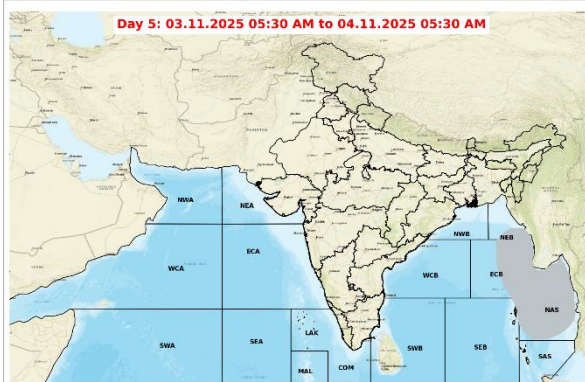
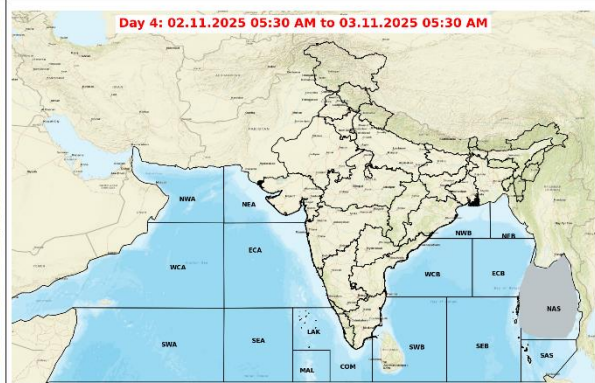
