Subject: Depression over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining East Rajasthan & Gujarat Region

The Depression over southwest Madhya Pradesh and neighbourhood moved nearly west-northwestwards with a speed of 23 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centred at 2330 hrs IST of 31st July 2026, over **southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining East Rajasthan & Gujarat Region** near latitude 23.0°N and longitude 75.2°E, 70 km west-northwest of Indore (Madhya Pradesh), 210 km east-northeast of Baroda (Gujarat), 220 km southeast of Udaipur (Rajasthan), 250 km south-southwest of Kota (Rajasthan) and 260 km east of Ahmedabad (Gujarat).

It is very likely to move west-northwestwards across west Madhya Pradesh and adjoining East Rajasthan & Gujarat Region and weaken into a well marked low pressure area during next 12 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Gujarat Region: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is very likely with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on 1st August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 2nd August.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is likely with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and **extremely heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 2nd August.

Madhya Maharashtra: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is very likely with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 01st and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 02nd & 3rd August.

Konkan & Goa: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is very likely with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 2nd & 3rd August.

East Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is very likely with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 01st and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 2nd August.

West Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is very likely with **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st & 2nd August.

West Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places is very likely with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 01st August.

(ii) Wind Warning:

- ❖ Squally winds with speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is very likely to prevail over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining Madhya Maharashtra during next 12 hours.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall and squally winds

Impact expected:

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- ❖ There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Helicopter services to be regulated.

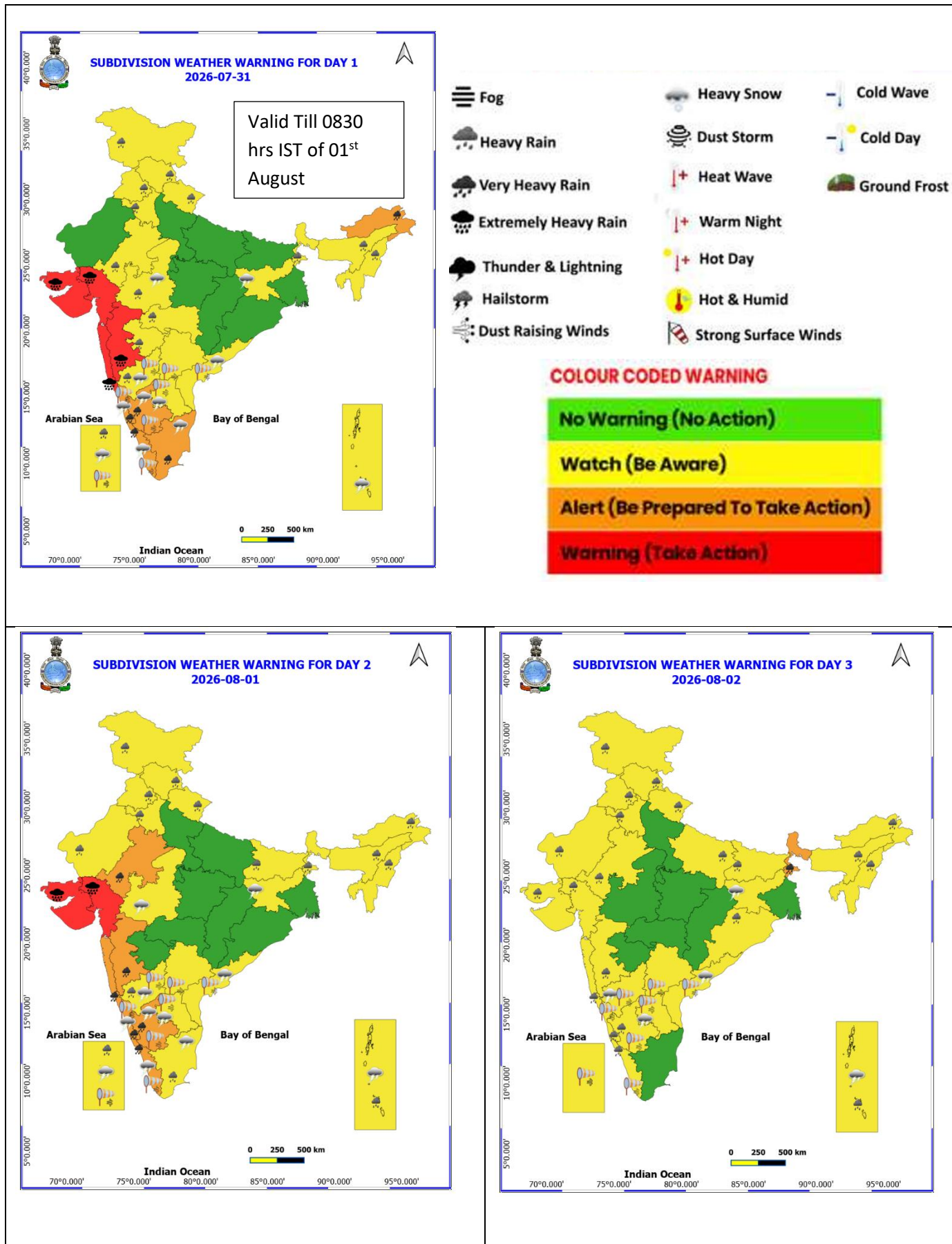

Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

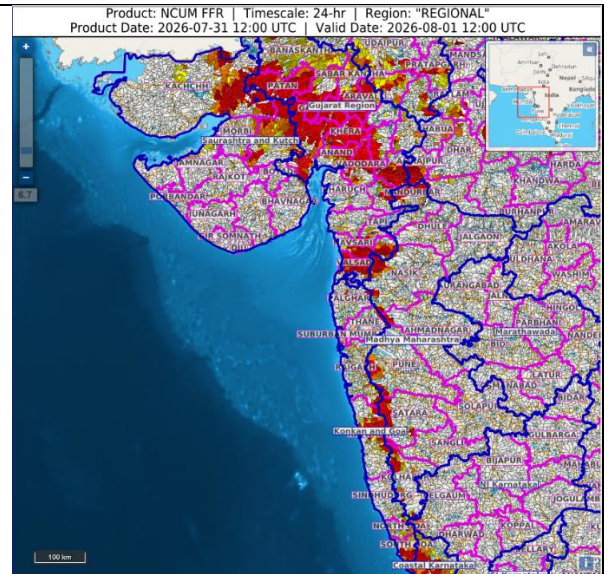
West Madhya Pradesh - Alirajpur, Barwani, Jhabua, Ratlam, Dhardistricts.

Gujarat Region - Dadar & Nagar Haveli, Daman, Ahmadabad, Anand, Aravalli, Banaskantha, Bharuch, Chhota Udepur, Dahod, Dangs, Gandhinagar, Khera, Mahesana, Mahisagar, Narmada, Navsari, Panchmahal, Patan, Sabar Kantha, Surat, Tapi, Vadodara and Valsad districts.

Saurashtra & Kutch - Bhavnagar, Rajkot, Surendranagar, Jamnagar, Morbi and Kachchh districts. Konkan & Goa - Palghar, Raigarh, Ratnagiri and Thane districts.

Madhya Maharashtra - Nandurbar, Nasik, Pune and Satara districts.

Surface runoff/ Inundation may occur at some fully saturated soils & low-lying areas over Area of Concern (AoC) as shown in map due to expected rainfall occurrence in next 24 hours.
