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Subject: Depression over north Chhattisgarh and adjoining areas of southeast Uttar Pradesh and northeast Madhya Pradesh

The depression over south Jharkhand and adjoining north Chhattisgarh moved west-northwestwards with a speed of 32 kmph during past 6 hours, and lay centred at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 6th July 2026, over north Chhattisgarh and adjoining areas of southeast Uttar Pradesh and northeast Madhya Pradesh, near latitude 23.8°N and longitude 82.7°E, about 90 km northwest of Ambikapur (Chhattisgarh), 110 km southeast of Sidhi (Uttar Pradesh), 190 km east of Umaria (Madhya Pradesh) and 210 km east-southeast of Satna (Madhya Pradesh).

It is very likely to move nearly west-northwestwards across North Chhattisgarh & east Madhya Pradesh and weaken into a well marked low pressure area during next 24 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall (7-20cm) at isolated places on 6th July and heavy rainfall (7-11cm) at isolated places on 7th July.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very rainfall at isolated places on 6th July and isolated heavy rainfall during 7th – 8th July.

Chhattisgarh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall (≥ 21 cm) at isolated places on 6th July; heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th July.

Gangetic West Bengal: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th July & 10th July.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th & 8th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th July.

Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 6th to 8th July; heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th & 10th July.

Konkan and Goa: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th & 7th July, heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th July.

Madhya Maharashtra: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places during 6th – 8th July; heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 10th July.

Marathwada: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th July.

Vidarbha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th & 8th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th July.

East Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very rainfall at isolated places during 6th to 9th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 10th July.

West Rajasthan: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 7th & 8th July.

Gujarat region: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th to 7th July; heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th July and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 9th July.

Saurashtra & Kutch: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places and extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th to 7th July; and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 8th July.

East Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places on 6th and 9th July and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places on 10th July.

West Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places during 7th -10th July.

(ii) Wind Warning:

- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail over northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off north Odisha-West Bengal coasts till 7th July and decrease gradually thereafter.
- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is likely to prevail over central and northeast Bay of Bengal till 7th July and decrease gradually thereafter..
- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph is likely to prevail over north Chhattisgarh and adjoining East Madhya Pradesh & Southeast Uttar Pradesh till evening of 7th July and decrease gradually thereafter.

(iii) Sea Condition:

- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough** over northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off north Odisha-West Bengal coasts till 7th July and improve gradually thereafter.
- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough to moderate** over central and northeast Bay of Bengal till 7th July and improve gradually thereafter.

(iv) Fishermen Warning (Graphics Attached):

- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off Odisha, and West Bengal coasts till 7th July.
- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into central and northeast Bay of Bengal till 7th July 2026.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall and squally winds

Impact expected:

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- ❖ There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- ❖ Helicopter services to be regulated.

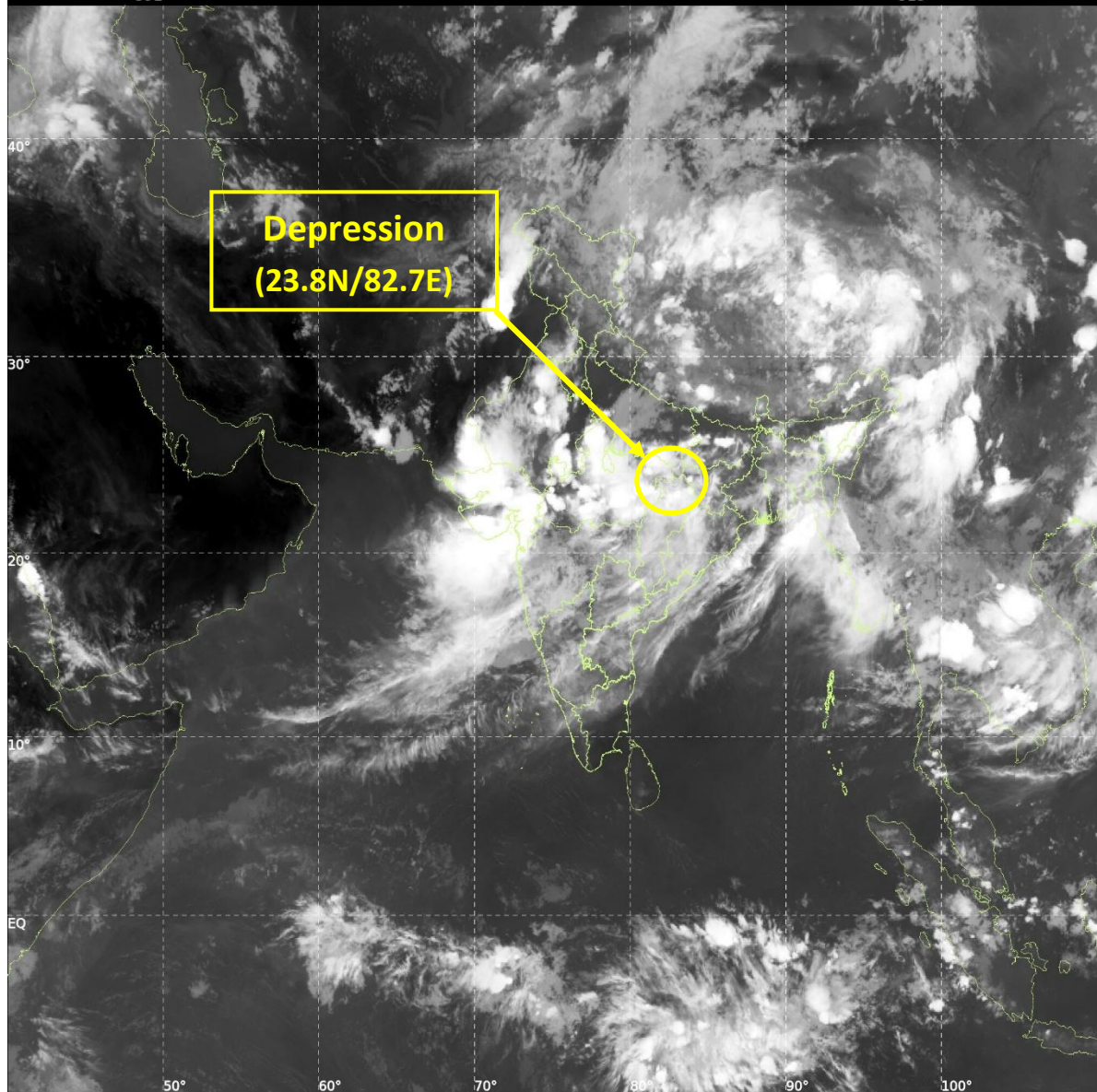

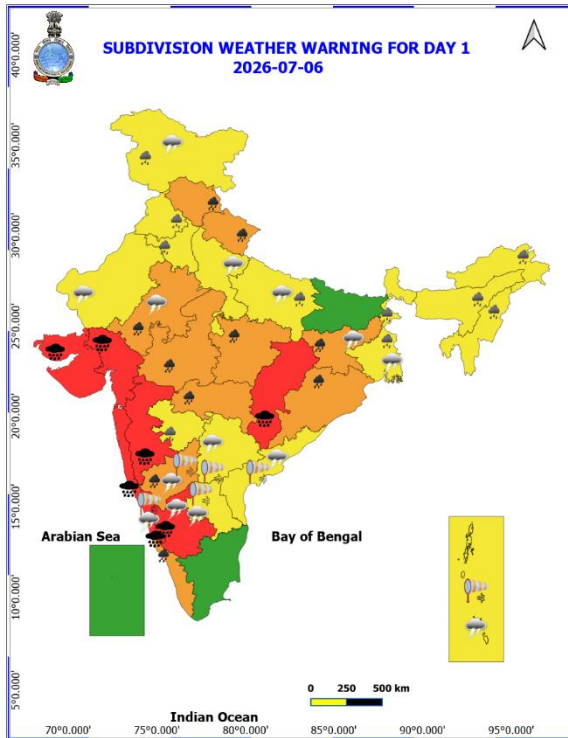

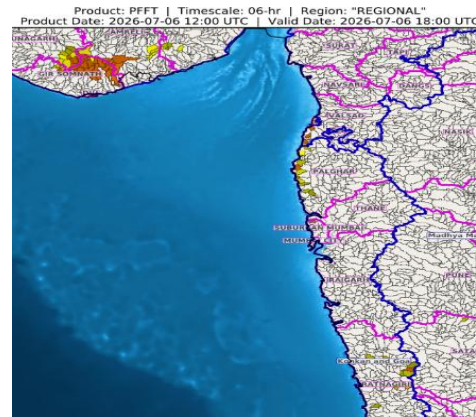


Flash Flood Guidance

Low to Moderate flash flood threat likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 6 hours.

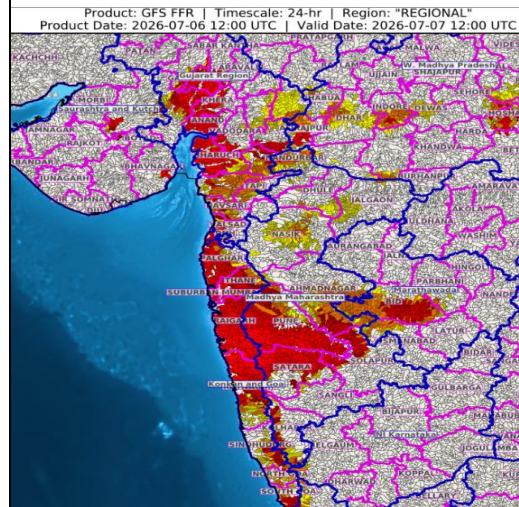
Gujarat Region - Valsad district.

Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

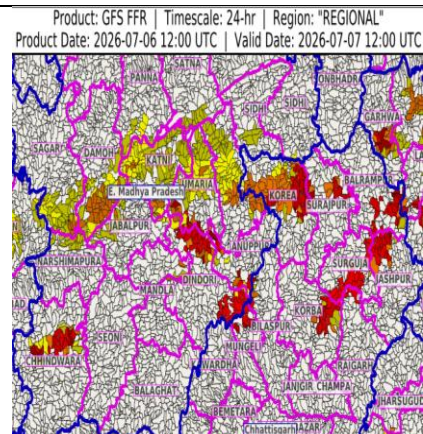

Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

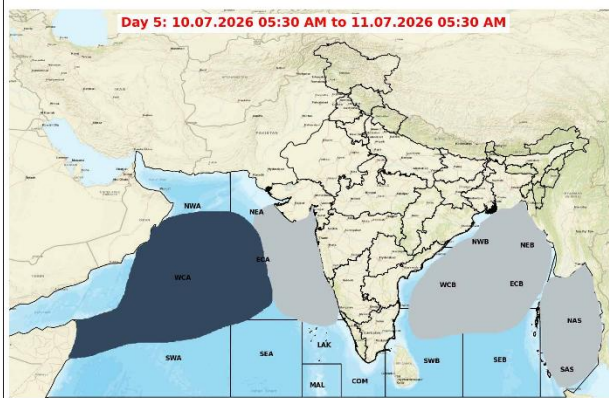
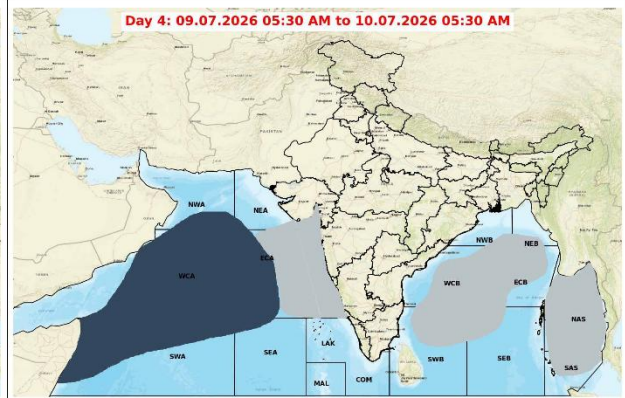
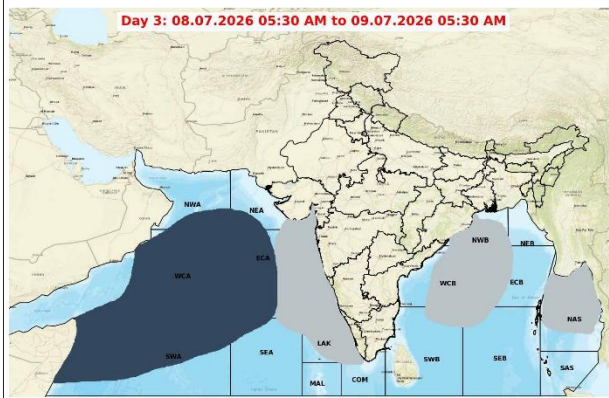
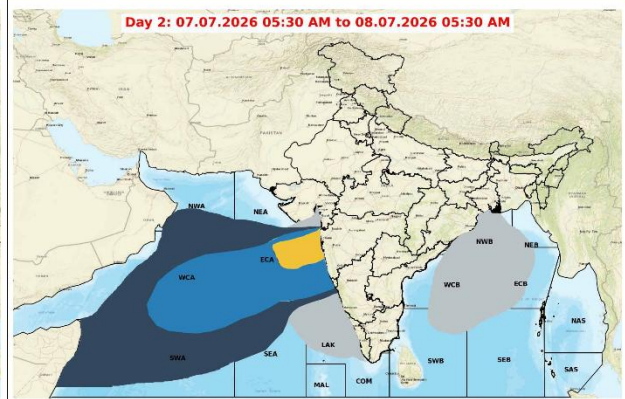
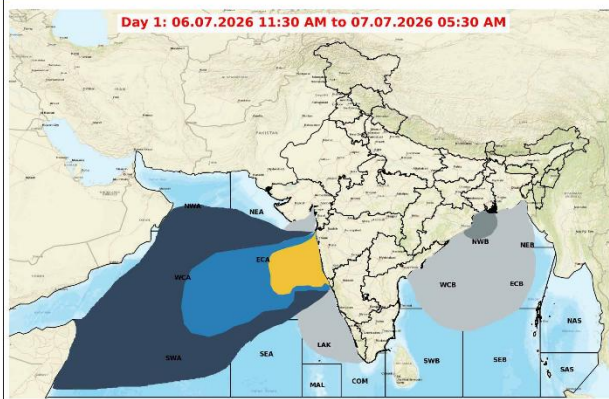
Chhattisgarh - Balarampur, Bilaspur, Jashpur, Korba, Korea, Surajpur and Surguja districts.
