Subject: (A) Well Marked Low Pressure area over central Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood (B) Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea

#### (A) Well Marked Low Pressure area over central Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood

The Well Marked Low Pressure Area [Remnant of Severe Cyclonic Storm "Montha"] over central Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood persisted over the same region at 2330 hrs IST of yesterday, the 30th October 2025.

It is likely to move nearly northwards across north Chhattisgarh and weaken into a low pressure area during next 12 hours.

#### Warning:

#### (i) Rainfall Warning (Graphics Enclosed):

**Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim:** Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 01<sup>st</sup> November and **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October.

**Bihar:** Light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places with isolated **heavy rainfall** on on 31st October.

#### (iii) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain

#### (Bihar and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim)

- ❖ Damage to paddy crops, horticultural and standing crops and orchards due to inundation.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic due to water logging.

#### **Action suggested:**

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly. Do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

#### (B) Depression over Eastcentral Arabian Sea

The Depression over eastcentral Arabian Sea moved slowly northwards during past 6 hours with a speed of 3 kmph and lay centered at 2330 hrs IST of yesterday, the 30th October 2025, over the same region, near latitude 18.3°N & longitude 68.2°E, about 370 km southwest of Veraval (Gujarat), 500 km west of Mumbai (Maharashtra) and 680 km west-northwest of Panjim (Goa).

It is likely to move nearly northwards across Eastcentral Arabian Sea during next 24 hours.

#### Warnings:

#### (i) Rainfall Warning:

**Gujarat region:** Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places is very likely during 31<sup>st</sup> October to 1st November.

**Saurashtra & Kutch:** Light to moderate rainfall at many places with **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 31st October. Rainfall activity would decrease thereafter with light to moderate rainfall at many places and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places on 1st November.

#### (ii) Wind warning:

Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail around the system center over Eastcentral Arabian Sea till 31<sup>st</sup> October.

Squally weather with wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is very likely to prevail over northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 31<sup>st</sup> October evening, becoming 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph till 1<sup>st</sup> November.

#### (iii) Sea condition:

Sea Condition is likely to be rough to very rough over Eastcentral and northeast Arabian Sea & along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 1st November.

#### (iv) Fishermen warnings:

Fishermen are advised not to venture into Eastcentral & northeast Arabian Sea and along & off Maharashtra and Gujarat coasts till 1<sup>st</sup> November.

# (v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rain and strong winds (North Konkan and coastal districts of Gujarat state)

#### Impact expected:

- Strong and squally wind and heavy rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to strong winds and heavy rain.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain.
- ❖ There could be localised flash floods, landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Surface & Helicopter services may be regulated.
- Small ships & country boats would be affected due to strong wind and heavy rain.

#### **Action suggested:**

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Surface transport and helicopter services to be regulated.




